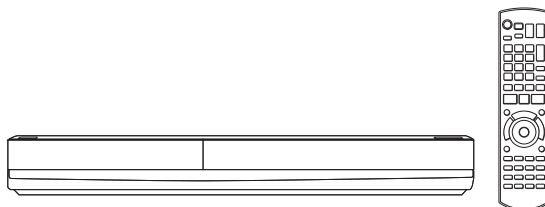

# Safety precautions

### Unit

### AC mains lead

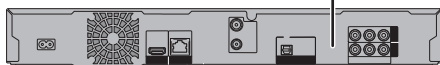
### Placement

## • Disc recorded on another device

- It may be necessary to finalize the disc, create Top Menu or close the session on the equipment used for recording to play on this unit.
- **DVD-RW** Recorded in DVD Video Recording (DVD-VR) format
  - This unit can play back and copy to HDD.
  - This unit does not support editing or recording.
  - It is possible to record and edit with DVD-Video (DVD-V) format by formatting discs with this unit.
- Recording may not be possible to discs which were used for recording on other equipment.

## • Play on other players

- **DVD-R** **DVD-RW** **+R** **+RW** Finalisation is needed. (⇒ 61)
- **+RW** If the disc failed to play on other equipment, we recommend you create a Top Menu (⇒ 61).

## • Regarding 8 cm Disc

This unit cannot record or edit the 8 cm disc. Only playback or copy to the HDD is possible.

### Notes for the USB devices

- This unit does not guarantee connection with all USB devices.
- FAT16 and FAT32 file systems are supported.
- This unit supports USB 2.0 High Speed.



- USB memories support DivX files less than 4 GB.

### Notes for the SD cards

#### • Using miniSD card or microSD card

Mini-type and micro-type cards can also be used, but must be used with adaptor cards (optional).

### To format an SD card

Refer to "Format Disc/Format Card". (⇒ 60)



- Usable memory is slightly less than the card capacity.
- If the SD card is formatted on other equipment, the time necessary for recording may be longer or the card may not be able to be used on this unit. In these cases, format the card on this unit.
- SDHC Memory Cards and SDXC Memory Cards can be used in equipment that is compatible with the appropriate cards. (SDHC Memory Cards can also be used in equipment compatible with SDXC Memory Cards)

### Media handling

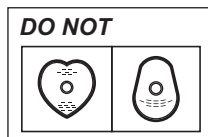
- Do not touch the recorded surface of the discs or the terminal surface of the SD cards.



- If there is dirt or condensation on the disc, wipe with a damp cloth and then wipe dry.



- Do not attach labels or stickers to discs.
- Do not use disc cleaning sprays, benzene, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Do not use ballpoint pens or other hard writing implements, when writing on the label side of the disc.
- Do not drop, stack, or impact discs.
- Do not place objects on discs.
- Do not use the following discs:
  - Discs with exposed adhesive from removed stickers or labels (rental discs, etc.).
  - Discs that are badly warped or cracked.
  - Irregularly shaped discs.



- Do not expose the terminals of the SD card to water, garbage or other strange things.
- Do not place in the following areas:
  - In hot places, such as under the direct sunlight.
  - In very dusty or humid areas.
  - Locations susceptible to significant difference in temperature (condensation can occur).
  - Where static electricity or electromagnetic waves occur.

# Unit care

## HDD handling care

- **The HDD is a high precision device**

The HDD is a high precision recording instrument and is easily susceptible to damage. Therefore, be careful of the following points while the unit is turned on, especially during operation, otherwise the HDD and the recorded content may be damaged:

- Do not subject the unit to any vibration and shock.
- Do not remove the AC mains lead from the household mains socket.

- **The HDD is a temporary storage device**

- The HDD is not an everlasting storage device. It is recommended to save the recorded content on a disc or to keep the original data or CDs that they were copied from.
- If you notice a problem with the HDD such as repetitive strange sounds, immediately save (backup) all content and request service. If you continue using the HDD with a problem, the unit or the recorded content will be damaged.

- **If the HDD is damaged, the recorded content cannot be recovered.**

## Setup precautions

- **Place the unit on a surface that is flat and not subject to vibration or impact.**
- **Do not place on anything that generates heat like a Set Top Box, etc.**
- **Place in an area where condensation does not occur. Conditions where condensation may occur**
  - When there is an extreme change in temperature (e.g., when subjected to an air conditioner or when cooled air directly impacts the unit).
  - When there is high humidity or a lot of steam in the room.

In the above situation, **without turning the unit on**, let the unit adjust to the room temperature and wait 2–3 hours until condensation is gone.

- **Do not block the cooling fan on the rear of the unit.**
- **The unit may breakdown if cigarette smoke or bug spray/vapour, etc. gets inside the unit.**

## When moving the unit

Before moving the unit, ensure the disc tray is empty.

- 1 Switch the unit to standby mode. (Wait until “BYE” disappears from the display.)
- 2 Remove the AC mains lead from the household mains socket.
- 3 Move only after the unit has come to a complete stop (approx. 3 minutes) in order to avoid subjecting to vibration and shock. (Even after the unit is switched to standby mode, the HDD continues operating for a short time.)

## Cleaning

- **This unit**

- Wipe with a soft, dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, paint thinner or benzene to clean this unit.
- Before using chemically treated cloth, carefully read the instructions that came with the cloth.

- **This unit's lens**

Use the **Lens cleaner** (optional) to clean the unit's lens.

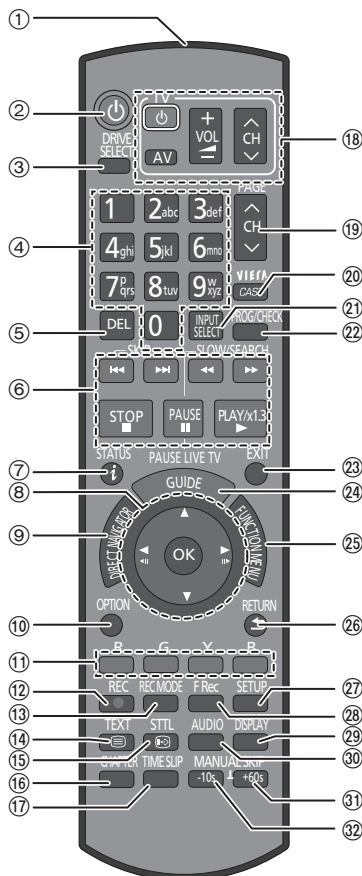

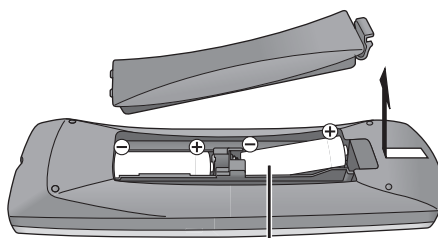

- ⑤ To delete unwanted recorded titles, timer programmes, pictures or music (⇒ 35)
- ⑥ Basic operations for recording and play, PAUSE LIVE TV (⇒ 22)
- ⑦ Show Information (⇒ 21, 30, 33)
- ⑧ Selection/OK, Frame-by-frame (⇒ 33)
- ⑨ Show DIRECT NAVIGATOR, Top Menu (⇒ 29, 34)
- ⑩ Show OPTION menu (⇒ 36, 48, 55)

#### Convert Only:

The original title remains after conversion.

"COPY" on the unit's display remains lighted during conversion.

### Notes for normal speed copy

**[DVD-R] [DVD-RW] [+R] [+RW]**

  - When the number of titles recorded to the HDD and the number of titles to be copied to the disc is greater than 999 in total.
- If copy is cancelled during the step while temporarily copying to the HDD, then nothing will be copied.
- Even if the title was not copied to the disc, the amount of remaining writable disc space becomes less.

### Notes for copying to the DVD-RAM

When copying to DVD-RAM using "8 hours" mode, play may not be possible on DVD players that are compatible with DVD-RAM. Use "6 hours" mode if playback may be on other equipment. (⇒ 70, Recording time in EP mode)

### About maintaining the chapter mark

- The position of the chapter might shift slightly.
- Maximum number of chapters on the disc is limited.
  - **[RAM] [DVD-R] [DVD-RW]** : Approx. 1000
  - **[+R] [+RW]** : Approx. 254  
(Depends on the state of recording.)

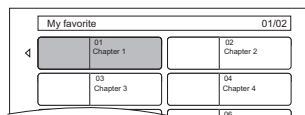

- 6** Select "Yes", then press [OK] to start copying.
  - When the top menu is displayed Select the title you want to start copying, then press [OK].



After the last title on the disc has finished playing the Top Menu is recorded until the set time is reached.

### To stop copying

- If stopped partway, copying will be up to that point.

### Power off link

When you set the TV to standby mode, the unit is also automatically set to standby mode.

- Power off link function does not work when recording, copying, finalising etc.

### Playing music continuously even after turning off power to the TV

The following operations make it possible to keep the power of the unit on and to play music continuously.

When the unit is directly connected to an amplifier/receiver.

---

Select how to output audio with a sampling frequency of 96 kHz.

- On:
  - Signals are converted to 48 kHz.

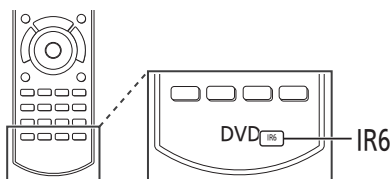

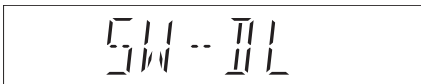

## Entering text

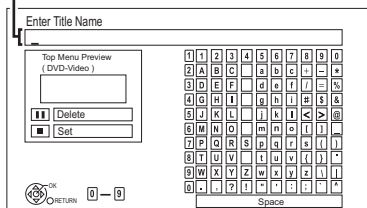
### Preparation

- Show the "Enter Title Name" screen, etc.

- 1 Select a character, then press [OK].  
Repeat this step to enter other characters.

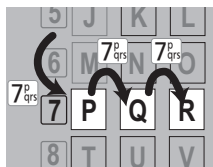

- To enter characters with number buttons:

- 2 Press [STOP ■] (Set).  
"Writing..." appears then the screen returns to the previous screen and so on.

### To end partway

Press [RETURN ☺]. (Text is not added.)



- The maximum number of characters depends on the media.
- If a name is long, parts of it may not be shown in some screens.

## Switching the aspect ratio of the screen

When the image does not match the screen size of the TV, you can enlarge the image to fill the screen.

- 1 Press [OPTION].
- 2 Select "Aspect", then press [OK].
- 3 Select the item, then press [OK].

### Normal:

Normal output

### Side cut:

The black bars on the right and left sides of the 16:9 image disappear and the image is enlarged.

### Zoom:

The black bars on the top and bottom sides of the 4:3 image disappear and the image is enlarged.



- It may also be adjusted using the screen mode of the TV etc.
- The screen mode is switched to "Normal" in the following situations:
  - when you change the channel
  - when you start or end the playback of a title
  - when you switch the unit on or to standby mode.
- [DVD-V] "Side cut" does not have any effect.

# Troubleshooting guide

Before requesting service, make the following checks. If the problem still persists, consult your dealer for instructions.

Updating to the latest software (firmware) may solve the problem. (⇒ 80)

## The following do not indicate a problem with this unit:

- Regular disc rotating sounds or HDD rotating sounds.
- Poor reception due to atmospheric conditions.
- Image disturbance during search.
- Interruptions in reception due to periodic broadcasting breaks.
- When you switch the unit on or to standby mode, there may be an unexpected sound.

## General operation

### The unit doesn't work.

- Check the connections. (⇒ 13)
- One of the unit's safety devices may have been activated.

Reset the unit as follows:

- 1 Press [⏻/I] on the main unit to switch the unit to standby.
  - If the unit doesn't switch to standby, press [⏻/I] on the main unit for about 3 seconds. The unit is forcibly switched to standby. Alternatively, disconnect the AC mains lead, wait one minute, then reconnect it.
- 2 Press [⏻/I] on the main unit to switch it on. If the unit still cannot be operated, consult the dealer.

### Cannot eject disc.

The unit may have a problem. While the unit is in standby mode, press and hold [STOP ■] and [CH ^] on the main unit at the same time for about 5 seconds.

### The unit is switched to standby mode automatically.

- VIERA Link has worked. (⇒ 62, Power off link)

### The remote control doesn't work.

- The remote control and main unit are using different codes. Change the code on the remote control.



Unit's display

Press and hold [OK] and the indicated number button at the same time for more than 5 seconds. (⇒ 77)

- Software (firmware) is updating when "UPD □/□" is displaying on the unit's display. Wait until the update is completed. (⇒ 80)
- The HOLD function is activated. (⇒ 81)

### Startup is slow.

- Startup takes time in the following situations:
  - A disc is inserted.
  - The clock is not set.
  - Immediately after a power failure or the AC mains lead is connected.
  - When the "Power Save in Standby" is activated. (⇒ 77)

## Displays

### "0:00" is flashing on the unit's display.

- Set the clock. (⇒ 78)

### The clock does not display on the unit when switched to standby.

- The clock does not display when "Power Save in Standby" is activated. (⇒ 77)

## TV screen and video

### Screen size is wrong.

- Check the "TV Aspect" or "Aspect for 4:3 Video". (⇒ 74)
- Adjust the aspect ratio setting on TV.
- If you connect to 4:3 TV, set "HDMI Video Format" to "576p/480p". (⇒ 66, 74)
- Check "Aspect for Recording" before recording or file conversion. (⇒ 66, 70)

### The black screen appears on the TV.

- This phenomenon may occur, depending on the TV setting, when "Power Save in Standby" is set to "Off". Depending on the TV, this phenomenon may be prevented by reconnecting to a different HDMI input terminal.

### Picture does not appear with the HD quality although HD setting was made.

- The pictures are output with 576p/480p depending on the title.

## Troubleshooting guide

### The screen changes automatically.

- If "Screen Saver" set to "On", the screen saver function will be activated when there is no operation for 5 minutes or more. (⇒ 74)

### There is a lot of image lag when playing video.

- Set "HD optimizer" in the Picture menu to "Off". (⇒ 65)

### The images do not appear on the TV.

#### The picture is distorted during play, or video will not play correctly.

- Check the connections. (⇒ 13)
- Check the settings of the connected TV, etc.
- The unit's TV System is different from that of the disc. While stopped, keep pressing [STOP ■] and [▲ OPEN/CLOSE] on the main unit for 5 or more seconds. The system switches from PAL to NTSC or vice versa.
- Picture may not be seen when more than 4 devices are connected with HDMI cables. Reduce the number of connected devices.
- The picture may be distorted or a black screen may appear between scenes recorded with different aspect ratios.
- Set "Deep Colour Output" (⇒ 66, 75) or "Contents Type Flag" (⇒ 66, 75) to "Off".

## Sound

### No sound.

#### Distorted sound.

- Check the connections. (⇒ 13)
- Check the settings of the connected TV, etc.
- Press [AUDIO] to select the audio. (⇒ 34)
- To output audio from a device connected with an HDMI cable, set "HDMI Audio Output" to "On". (⇒ 66, 75)

### Cannot change audio channel.

- You cannot switch the audio channel if "Digital Audio Output" is set to "Bitstream". (⇒ 73)

## Recording, timer recording and copying

### Cannot record.

#### Cannot copy.

- Some broadcasts are copyright protected.
- You cannot record to the disc by pressing the [● REC] or timer recording.
- The disc is protected. (⇒ 8, 60)
- [DVD-R] [DVD-RW] [+R] [+RW] Since it will copy to HDD temporarily, copying is not possible if there is insufficient available capacity on the HDD.
- [DVD-R] [DVD-RW] [+R] [+RW] Copying or editing may not be possible on these discs after ejecting and loading the disc or switching the unit on or to standby mode for approximately 30 times after being recorded to.
- This unit cannot record/copy NTSC signals to discs that already have PAL signal recordings.

### Auto Renewal Recording does not work properly.

- The programme will not be overwritten in the following cases:
    - the programme is protected
    - any programme is being played back or copied
    - a screen such as DIRECT NAVIGATOR is displayed
- Instead, the programme will be saved as a separate programme and that will be overwritten.

### A part or whole of a recorded title has been lost.

- If there is a power failure or the AC mains lead is disconnected from the household mains socket while recording or editing, the title may be lost or the HDD may become unusable. We cannot offer any guarantee regarding lost programmes.

### An unusually loud sound is coming from the rotating disc.

- If you want copy to perform more quietly, select "Normal ( Silent )" in "DVD Speed for High Speed Copy". (⇒ 66, 71)

### The time recorded on the disc and the available time shown do not add up.

- **[DVD-R] [R]** If you record or edit many times, the remaining capacity is reduced and then recording or editing may be disabled.
- Available disc space display may be different from actual.

## Play

### Cannot playback.

- The disc is dirty. (⇒ 9)
- The disc is scratched or marked.
- The disc may not be able to play back if it was not finalized or a Top Menu was not created on the equipment used for recording.

### Audio and video momentarily pause.

- DVD-R DL and +R DL discs have two writable layers on one side. Video and audio may momentarily cut out when the unit is switching layers.

### DVD-Video is not played.

- Ensure the disc is for the correct DVD-Video region number, and is not defective.

### You have forgotten your rating PIN.

- The rating level returns to the factory preset. While the disc tray is open, press [DRIVE SELECT] to select the DVD drive, then press and hold [● REC] and [▶/× 1.3] on the main unit at the same time for 5 or more seconds ("INIT" will appear on the unit's display).

### Image for the Quick View is not smooth.

- Image may not be played back smoothly in case of DR, HG, HX, HE, HL, HM mode titles or AVCHD format titles.

### Cannot play the disc on other players.

- **[DVD-R] [DVD-RW] [R] [RW]** The disc must be finalised or have a Top Menu created. (⇒ 61)
- **[DVD-R]** The disc created in AVCHD format can only be played back on AVCHD compatible equipment.

## Troubleshooting guide

### Edit

**The available recording time doesn't increase even after deleting titles on the disc.**

- **[DVD-R] [R]** Available space on the disc does not increase even after deleting titles.
- **[DVD-RW] [RW]** Available space on the disc increases when you delete the last title.

**Cannot edit.**

- You may not be able to edit on the HDD if there is no available space. Delete any unwanted titles to create empty space. (⇒ 35)

**Cannot create a playlist.**

- Creation or editing of playlists cannot be done on this unit.

### Picture

**The contents of the SD card cannot be read.**

- Remove the card from the slot and then insert again. If this does not solve the problem, switch the unit to standby mode and turn it on again.

**Copying, deleting and setting protection takes a long time.**

- When there are a lot of folders and files, it may sometimes take a long time.

**Pictures do not play back normally.**

- The images that were edited on the PC, such as PROGRESSIVE JPEG, etc., may not play back. (⇒ 95)

### Music

**Tracks could not be copied to the HDD.**

- Copyright protected tracks such as SCMS restrictions will not be copied.
- Recording from CDs that do not conform to CD-DA specifications (copy control CDs, etc.) cannot be guaranteed.

### USB

**This unit does not recognize the USB device correctly.**

- If inserted during playback the USB device may not be recognized by this unit. Disconnect and reconnect the USB device. If it still does not recognize the connection, switch the unit to standby mode and turn it on again.
- USB devices connected using a USB extension cable other than a dedicated one or a USB hub may not be recognized by this unit.

### TV Guide

**The TV Guide information is not displayed properly.**

- Set the clock correctly. (⇒ 66, 78, Clock)
- Some broadcast may not send programme information.
- There was a programme change, or TV Guide information from a broadcast station was possibly not correctly transmitted.
- If signal quality is bad, the TV Guide system may not be able to receive any data.

## Broadcast

### **Picture regularly breaks up on some channels.**

- Adjust the aerial reception with "Manual Tuning".  
(⇒ 66, 69)

### **Picture very infrequently breaks up on some or all channels.**

- Electrical atmospheric interference caused by bad weather may cause pictures to break up and audio to mute or distort momentarily.

## VIERA Link

### **VIERA Link doesn't work.**

- Some functions may not work depending on the version of "HDAVI Control" of the connected TV, etc. This unit supports "HDAVI Control 5" functions.
