- The TV panel may be awkward to install on your own. We recommend you ask someone to help with installation and/or removal of the stand.

Attaching the stand

Step 1: Place a soft cushioned material on top of a flat surface to prevent damaging the screen panel. Then place the TV monitor flat on top, with the screen side facing down, as illustrated in Fig. 3, right.



- **Step 2:** Align the stand with the neck of the TV, as illustrated in Fig. 4, right.
- **Step 3:** Tighten the screws (supplied) with a screwdriver to affix the stand to the panel, as illustrated in Fig. 5, below.

Getting Started

Using the remote control

When using the remote control, aim it at remote sensor on the television. If there is an object between the remote control and the remote sensor on the unit, the unit may not operate.

- Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the television.
- When using this television in a very brightly lit area, the infrared REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR may not work properly.
- The recommended effective distance for using the remote control is about 7 metres.

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control

- 1. Open the cover at the back of the remote control.
- Install two AAA size batteries. Make sure to match the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.
- 3. Replace the cover.

Battery replacement

You will need to install the batteries into the remote control to make it operate following the instruction below.

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control will be greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.

Notes on Using Batteries:

The use of the wrong type of batteries may cause chemical leakage and/or explosion. Please note the following:

- Always ensure that the batteries are inserted with the + and terminals in the correct direction as shown in the battery compartment.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries will shorten battery life and/or cause chemical leakage.
- Replace batteries as soon as they do not work.
- Chemicals which leak from batteries may cause skin irritation. If any chemical matter seeps out of the batteries, wipe it up immediately with a dry cloth.
- The batteries may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions. Remove the batteries whenever you anticipate that the remote control will not be used for an extended period.
- The batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

Cable Installation

Please read the relevant content in "Notice for Maintenance and Safety" carefully before the installation and use.

1. Take out the TV from the package and put it in a drafty and flat place.

NOTE:

• When you plug or unplug the TV, computer or other equipments, you must make sure that the AC power has been already shut down; when unplugging the power cable or signal cable, please hold the plug (the insulated part), do not draw the body of the cable.

- 2. The RF output terminal can be connected with the RF input port of the TV.
- 3. The output AV terminal of DVD can be connected with the AV input port of the TV through AV cable.
- 4. Connect one end of the VGA cable with the VGA port on computer, connect the other end of the VGA cable with the VGA port on the TV, and tighten the bolts clockwise on the each end of VGA cable.

NOTE:

 While connecting the 15-pin VGA, please do not insert the plug overexertedly, for fear the pin might be broken.

5. Connect one end of the HDMI cable with HDMI output port, connect the other end of the HDMI cable with the HDMI port on the TV.

NOTE:

 While connecting the HDMI, please insert carefully, do not insert overexertedly, for fear the pin might be broken.

- 6. Check and make sure that all AV cables are connected with the corresponding ports correctly.
- 7. Connect the AC power cable with 100-240VAC power supply.

NOTE:

The range of power input for the TV is 100-240VAC50/60HZ, do not connect the TV power input port with the AC power out of the above range.

Please hold the insulated part of the plug when you are unplugging the power cable, do
not touch directly the metallic part of the cable.

Basic Operation

QUICK START GUIDE

Connection

- 1. Connect the mains and antenna.
- 2. Press the U button on remote control to turn on TV from standby mode.

Initial Setup

When the TV is initially powered on, a sequence of on-screen prompts will assist in configuring basic settings.

- Select the desired OSD [On Screen Display] language. Press the ▲/▼/ ◀/ ▶ button, then press the OK button.
- Select the appropriate country.
 Press the ▲/▼/◀/▶ button to select the country, then press the OK button to Start Channel Tuning.

Turning on and off the TV

• Turn on the TV

Connect the AC input cable. At this time the TV will enter standby mode. Press the \mathbf{U} button on remote control to turn on TV from standby mode.

Turn off the TV

Press the 😃 button on the remote control to enter standby mode.

Do not leave your set in standby mode for long periods of time. It is best to unplug the set from the mains and aerial.

No signal

There is No Signal menu on screen when there is no input signal. In TV/DTV mode, if there is no signal in fifteen minutes, the TV will turn off automatically. In PC mode, the TV set will automatically turn off in five minutes if no input signal. When VGA cable is connected, the TV turns on automatically.

Programme Selection

• Using the CH+/CH- on the panel of TV or on the remote control.

Press CH+ to increase channel number. Press CH - to decrease channel number.

• Using O- 9 digital buttons.

You can select the channel number by pressing O to 9. (In TV, DTV mode)

Using -/-- button

Using-/-- button enables you to enter double digit channel numbers

Volume adjustment

- Press the VOL+/- button to adjust the volume.
- You can release mute by pressing the 🕱 or increase/decrease the volume.

Changing the Input Source

You can select the input source by pressing the INPUT button on the remote control. Press the \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to cycle through the input source, and press the OK button to confirm your choice.

How to Navigate Menus

Before using the TV follow the steps below to learn how to navigate the menu in order to select and adjust different functions. The access step may differ depending on the selected menu.

- 1. Press the MENU button to display the main menu.
- 2. Press the \checkmark button to cycle through the main menu.
- 3. Press the $\blacktriangle / \triangledown$ button to select the desired sub item.
- 4. Press the OK button to access the submenu.
- Press the ▲/▼/◀/▶ button to select the desired value. The adjustment in the OSD may differ depending on the selected menu.
- 6. Press the MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 7. Press the EXIT button exit from the menu.

NOTE:

- When an item in MENU is displayed Grey, it means that the item is not available or cannot be adjusted.
- Buttons on the TV have the same function as corresponding buttons on the remote control. If your remote control is lost or couldn't work, you may use the buttons on the TV to select menus. This manual focuses on operation of the remote control.

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Configuring the Channel Menu

Auto Tuning

Select the **OK** button to start Auto tuning.

1. Select the country and tune type for channels.

2. The TV will begin memorizing all of the available channels.

Once the progress bar is full, the found channels will be stored and the unit will proceed to the search for TV, DTV, Radio and Data. CHANNEL Programme Edit Schedule List Signal Information

If you press the MENU button in

TV searching, the Auto Tuning will skip to DTV searching as the above picture shows.

ATV Manual Tuning

Manual store for ATV channels. Press the ▲/▼ button to select items. Press the ◀/► button to adjust it. Press the EXIT to exit.

DTV Manual Tuning

Manual store for digital channels. Press the ◀/► button to select channel. Press the OK button to search. Press the EXIT button to exit.

Programme Edit

Press the \blacktriangle/ ∇ button select items. Press the red button to delete the channel.

Press the green button to rename the channel. (In ATV mode)

Press the yellow button to move the channel. (Except DTV channels with LCN) Press the blue button to skip the channel.

Press the FAV button to set the favorite channel.

The CH+/CH- button can be used to select the following or preceding page.

 Signal Information (In DTV mode) Display the current Signal Information.

Configuring the Picture Menu

Picture Mode

You can select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.

You can change the value of Contrast, Brightness, Colour, Tint and sharpness when the picture is in Personal mode.

- Contrast To adjust the picture's contrast.
- Brightness To adjust the picture's brightness.
- Colour

Adjusts intensity of all colours.

- Tint (only in the NTSC mode) To adjust the tint of the picture.
- Sharpness To adjust the picture's sharpness.
- Colour Temp Select the colour temperature of the picture.
- Noise Reduction

Reduces screen noise without compromising video quality.

Configuring the Sound Menu

Sound Mode

You can select a sound mode to suit your personal preferences.

You can change the value of Treble and Bass when the sound is in Personal mode.

Treble

To adjust the accompanying sound's treble.

Bass

To adjust the accompanying sound's bass.





Balance

You can adjust the sound balance of the speakers to preferred levels.

Auto Volume

Press \blacktriangle/ \lor button to select Auto Volume, then press OK button to select On or Off. This item used for reducing the difference between channel and program's volume automatically. It made the overall level to be even. This function will also reduce the fluctuation of the sound.

SPDIF Mode

Press \blacktriangle/ ∇ button to select SPDIF Mode, then press OK button to select Auto, Off or PCM.

AD Switch (In DTV mode)

This is an auxiliary audio function that provides an additional audio track for visually challenged persons. This function handles the Audio Stream for the AD (Audio Description), when it is sent along with the Main audio from the broadcaster. Users can turn the Audio Description On or Off and control the volume.

Configuring the Time Menu

Clock

Display the System time Recieved from DTV signal stream.

Time Zone

Select your time zone.

Press \blacktriangle/ \lor button to select Time Zone, then press OK button to enter sub-menu.Press $\blacktriangle/ \blacktriangledown/ \bigstar/ \bigstar/ \blacklozenge$ button to select

time zone.

Sleep Timer

Select the time to turn the TV to standby mode automatically.

Auto Standby

Select the Auto Standby time you want.

The TV will enter into standby mode automatically when there is no any operation in set time (the set time is 4 hours when leave the factory).

OSD Timer

Select On-Screen Menu displaying time.

The Clock will change with the area which you have selected in the Time Zone.

Configuring the Lock Menu

Lock System

The feature can prevent unauthorized operating the TV set, unless entering 4-digit password. When Lock System is on and the system is locked, we must input the system password at Auto Tuning, Manual Tuning, Programme Edit or Reset. Press the right number buttons for the password. The default password is **OOOO**.



Set Password

Press the \blacktriangle/∇ button to select Set Password, then press the OK button to enter sub-menu to set new password.

NOTE: If you forget, the super password of 4711 still valid.

Block Program (In TV/DTV mode)

Press the \blacktriangle/∇ button to select Block Program, then press the OK button to enter sub-menu.

Press the $\blacktriangle/ \checkmark$ button to select the program you want to lock, then press green button on your remote control. (To unlock program, input the password you set.) Press the button to save setting and the MENU button to back to the previous menu.

• Parental Guidance (In DTV mode)

Press the \blacktriangle / \triangledown button to select Parental Guidance, then press the OK button to enter sub-menu to select.

Key Lock

Press the $\blacktriangle/\checkmark$ button to select Key Lock, then press \checkmark/\checkmark buttont to select Off or On. When Key Lock's statue is on, you can't use the Key panel button.

Configuring the Option Menu

Press MENU button to display the main menu. Press ◀ / ► button to select SETUP in the main menu.



- 1. Press ▼/▲ button to select the option that you want to adjust in the SETUP menu.
- 2. Press ◀ / ► button to adjust.
- 3. After finishing your adjustment, press **MENU** button to save and return back to the previous menu.

OSD Language

Press \forall/ \blacktriangle button to select OSD Language, then press OK button to enter sub menu. Press $\forall/ \land/ \checkmark$ button to select OSD Language, default setting is English.

TT Language (Teletext)

Press▼/▲ button to select **TT Language**, then press **OK** button to enter sub menu. Press ▼/▲
I > button to select TT Language. (Teletext is no longer available in New Zealand)

Audio Language

Press \forall / \blacktriangle button to select Audio Language, then press OK button to enter sub menu. Press $\forall / \blacktriangle / \blacklozenge / \checkmark$ button to select Audio Language.

Hearing Impaired

Press \forall / \blacktriangle button to select Hearing impaired, then press OK button to select ON/OFF.

PVR File System

Press ▼/▲ button to select PVR File System, then press OK button to enter sub menu. (See page 16-17)

Aspect Ratio

Press \vee / \blacktriangle button to select Aspect Ratio, then press Enter button to enter sub-menu. Press \vee / \blacktriangle button to select aspect ratio. (Available options are: Auto, 4:3,16:9,Zoom,Stretch).

Blue Screen

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select Aspect Ratio, then press Enter button to enter sub-menu. Press ▼ / ▲ button to select aspect ratio. (Available options are: Auto, 4:3,16:9,Zoom,Stretch).

First Time Installation

Press \bigvee / \blacktriangle button to select First time installation, then press Enter button to enter.

Reset

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select Reset, then press Enter button to enter sub-menu.

Recording Operation

PVR settings

1. PVR File System

Press the MENU button, select SETUP menu, and select "PVR File System", then press OK button to enter the setting menu.



Please check whether your USB device works or not before recording.

Select Disc: Select the device for the Record files.

Check PVR File System: Check the system.

USB Disc: Display the USB state.

Format: Format the USB device for PVR operating.

Time Shift Size: Display the size of the USB device (The device has been formatted).

Speed: Display the speed of the USB device (The device has been formatted).

Free Record Limit: Display the Free Record Limit state.

When you press **REC** button in DTV mode, the screen will display the recording menu as below:



Note: a. display and exit the navigation menu by pressing the EXIT.

- b. Press STOP button to exit the recording mode.
- c. Press PLAY button to play the programme you are recording from the beginning.

2) Timeshift menu

Press II PAUSE button to enter the Timeshift mode in DTV mode, and the picture will be paused, the recording will begin.



Note: a. Press STOP button to exit the Timeshift mode.

b. Press **>** PLAY button to play the programme you are recording from the beginning.

Timer Recording Operation

1. Press MENU button, select channel menu, and then select schedule list option, please see below picture for reference



2. Then we enter the schedule setup list, here you can choose the program which you prefer to record. From the list you can know record start time and end time.

Troubleshooting Guide

Troubleshooting

Before contacting the service technician, perform the following simple checks. If any problem persists, unplug the TV and call for service:

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE SOLUTION
No sound and picture	 Check whether the main plug has been connected to a wall outlet. Check whether you have pressed the POWER button on the front of TV set. Check the picture contrast and brightness settings.
Normal picture but no sound	 Check the volume. Sound muted? Press the MUTE button. Try another channel, the problem may be with the broadcast. Are the audio cables installed properly?
The remote control does not work	 Check to see if there any object between the product and remote control causing obstruction. Are batteries installed with correct polarity (+ to +, - to -)? Correct remote operating mode set: TV, VCR etc.? Install new batteries
Power is suddenly turned off	 - Is the sleep timer set? - Check the power control settings. Power interrupted. - No broadcast on station tuned with auto activated.
Picture appears slowly after switching on	 This is normal, the image is muted during the product startup process. Please contact your service center, if the picture has not appeared after five minutes.
No or poor color or poor picture	 Adjust the color in menu option. Keep a sufficient distance between the product and the VCR. Try another channel, the problem may be with the broadcast. Are the VIDEO cables installed properly? Activate the any function to restore the brightness of the picture.
Horizontal/vertical bars or picture shaking	- Check for local interference such as an electrical appliance or power tool.
Poor reception on some channels	 Station or cable product experiencing problems. Tune to another station. Station signal is weak, reorient antenna to receive weaker station. Check for sources of possible interference.
Lines or streaks in pictures	- Check the antenna (Change the direction of the antenna).
No output from one of the speakers	- Adjust balance in menu option.

Troubleshooting FOR VGA Mode

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE SOLUTION
The signal is out of range.	 Adjust resolution, horizontal frequency, or vertical frequency. Check whether the signal cable is connected or loose. Check the input source.
Vertical bar or stripe on back ground & Horizontal Noise & Incorrect position.	- Work the auto configure or adjust clock, phase, or H/V position.
Screen color is unstable or single color.	Check the signal cable.Reinstall the PC video card.

Maintenance

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the screen

1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then used it to wipe the screen.

2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cleaning the cabinet

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence



If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power cord and antenna to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.

Disposal of old electrical appliances



The European directive 2002/96/EC on Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE), requires that old household electrical appliances must not be disposed of in the normal unsorted municipal waste stream. Old appliances must be collected separately in order to optimize the recovery and recycling of the materials they contain, and reduce the impact on human health and the environment.
