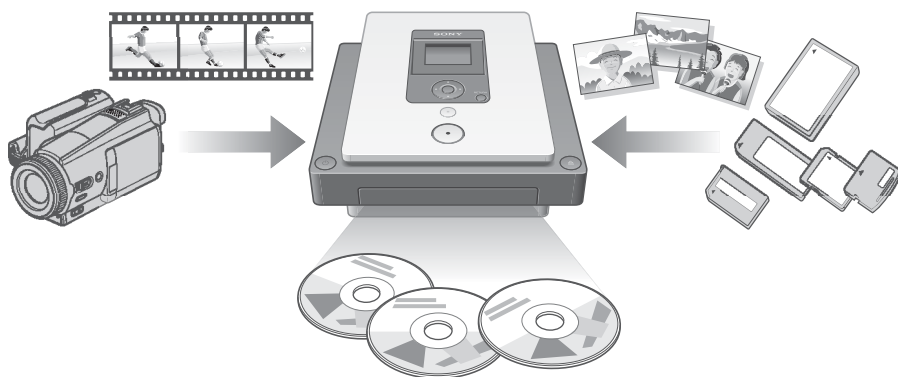
Introduction

Burning video DVDs

- ❑ You can record videos from connected video cameras and AV devices directly onto DVDs without using a computer.
- ❑ You can burn the entire contents of your HDD, DVD, or DV camcorder onto a DVD with one touch of the record button.

Burning photo DVDs

- ❑ You can archive photos from a memory card or HDD camcorder directly onto a DVD without using a computer.
- ❑ You can also create slideshows of the photos that will be playable on most DVD players.



Auto Setup Navigation

The DVDDirect automatically detects inserted memory cards and discs and input signals from connected devices. It then displays a message prompting the next necessary operation. Preparations for recording are made without any complicated button operations.

Direct printing operation

You can print out photos recorded on DVDs or memory cards by connecting the DVDDirect to a PictBridge-compatible printer using the supplied USB cable.

Computer-controlled operation

The DVDDirect can be used as a high speed DVD/CD drive with Hi-Speed USB (USB 2.0-compatible) interface when connected to a computer via USB cable.

The DVDDirect supports high speed recording to the latest format discs such as DVD+R double layer and DVD-R dual layer discs.

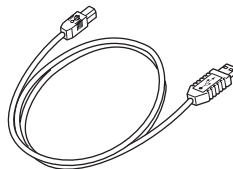

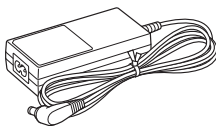

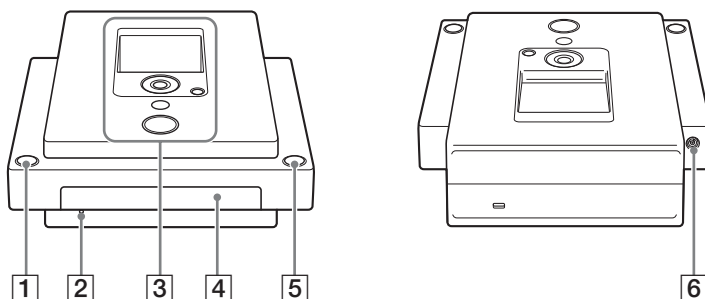

Parts and Controls

Front and rear



1 **(Power) button**

Turns the DVDDirect on or off.

2 **Emergency eject hole**

If you cannot open the disc tray with the  (Eject) button, turn off your computer, and then insert a thin, elongated object into this hole to eject the disc tray manually.

3 **Top panel**

The buttons and display for operating the DVDDirect are located here (page 11).

4 **Disc tray**

Insert a disc here with the label side up (page 17).

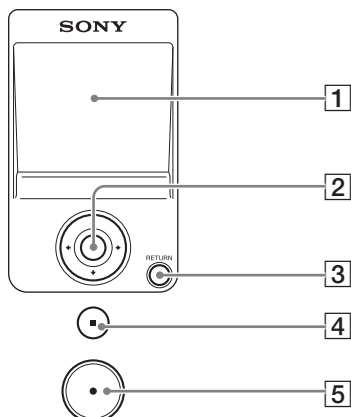
5 **(Eject) button**

Opens and closes the disc tray.

6 **DC IN connector**

Connect the supplied AC adaptor here (page 14).

Top panel



1 Display window

Displays a menu screen, images from a playback device, or photos from a memory card.

2 cursor / (Select) button

Selects a function.

3 RETURN button

This returns the display to the main menu screen or to the previous screen when navigating menus.

4 (Stop) button

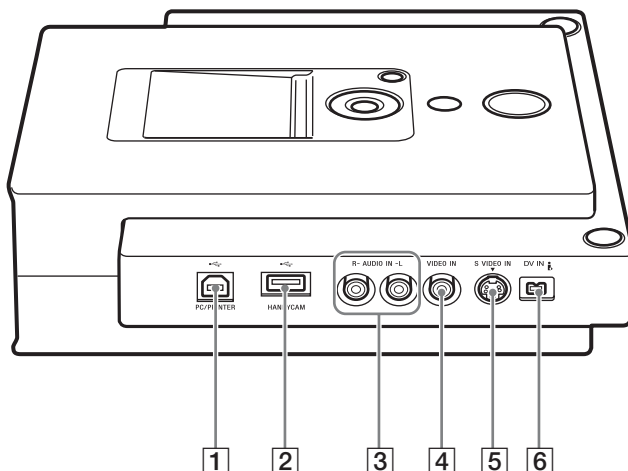
Stops recording.

5 (Record) button

Starts recording.

Lights red during recording.

Left side panel



1 USB connector (Type B)

Connect the supplied USB cable here when connecting the DVDirect to a computer or printer.

2 USB connector (Type A)

Connect the USB cable here when connecting a HDD or DVD camcorder.

Note

Only Sony HDD or DVD camcorder input is supported.

3 AUDIO IN L/R connectors

Connect the audio plugs of an AV cable (not supplied) here when connecting the DVDirect to a video device, such as a video camera or VCR.

4 VIDEO IN connector

Connect the video plug of an AV cable (not supplied) here when connecting the DVDirect to a video device, such as a video camera or VCR.

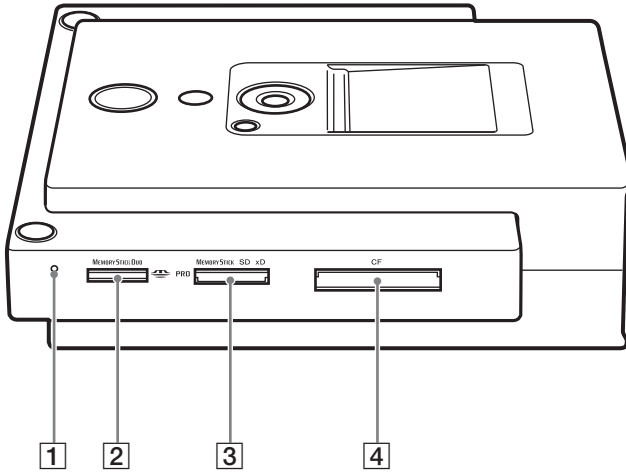
5 S VIDEO IN connector

Connect an S-video cable (not supplied) here when connecting the DVDirect to a video device with an S-video connector, such as a video camera or VCR.

6 DV IN connector (4-pin)

Connect a DV (i.LINK) cable (not supplied) here when connecting the DVDirect to a digital video camera.

Right side panel



1 Memory card LED

Lights amber when accessing the memory card.

2 Memory Stick Duo slot

Insert a "Memory Stick Duo" here.

3 Multi memory card slot

Insert a "Memory Stick," SD Card, or xD-Picture Card here.

4 CompactFlash card slot

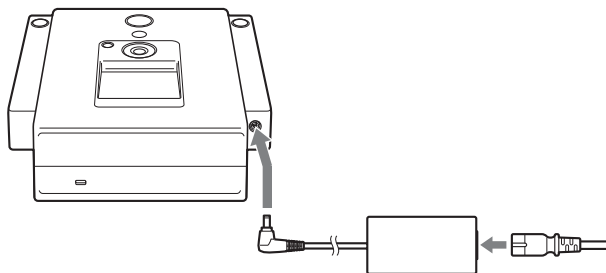
Insert a CompactFlash card here.

Note

You can use the memory card slot for both stand-alone and computer operation.

Turning the Power On/Off

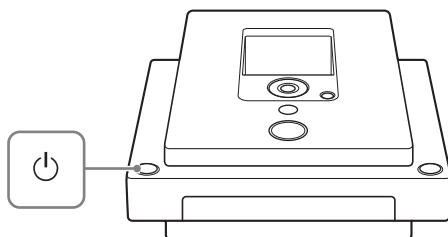
- 1 Connect the supplied AC power cord to the AC adaptor.
- 2 Insert the power plug of the AC adaptor into the DVDirect's DC IN connector.
- 3 Insert the power plug of the AC power cord into a power outlet.



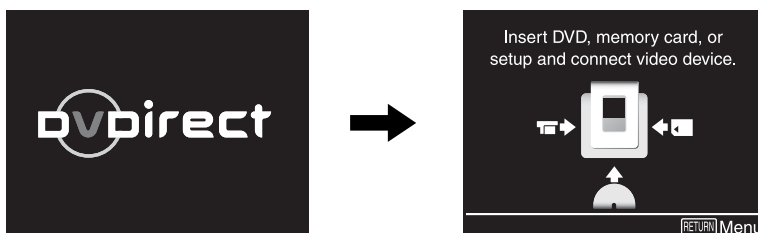
Notes

- Be sure to use the supplied AC power cord.
- Do not use damaged cables, such as cables with deformed connectors.

- 4 Press the  (Power) button.



After the display window lights and the DVDirect logo appears, a different screen appears depending on the DVDirect's current status.

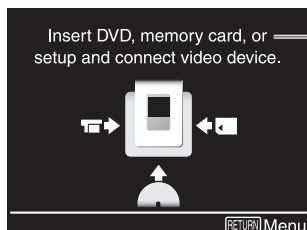


To turn power off

Press the  (Power) button again.

Auto Setup Navigation

After the power is turned on, the DVDirect automatically detects inserted memory cards and DVD discs and input signals from connected devices. A message indicating how to prepare for recording then appears in the display window. By following this message, you can automatically move on to the recording procedure you intended without complicated button operations.

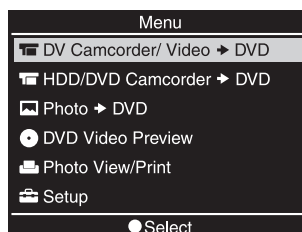
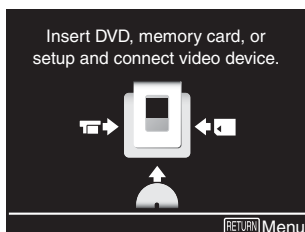
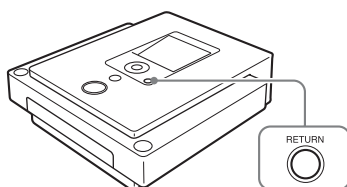


Messages and illustrations indicate the operations to perform next.

Accessing functions from the main menu

You can perform recording procedures manually by selecting options from the main menu. You can also go to the setup screen (Setup menu) from the main menu for various settings.

Press the RETURN button when [RETURN Menu] is displayed at the bottom right of the display window to return to the main menu.



Press **↑** or **↓** to select the desired operation, and press the **○** (Select) button.

DV Camcorder/Video ➡ DVD: Create a video DVD from a digital video camcorder connected via a DV (i.LINK) cable or from a video device connected via a video or S-video cable (page 31, 42).

HDD/DVD Camcorder ➡ DVD: Create a video DVD from an HDD or DVD camcorder connected via a USB cable (page 28, 31, 35, 39).

Photo ➡ DVD: Create a photo DVD (page 48).

DVD Video Preview: Playback a created video DVD (page 46).

Photo View/Print: Display or print out photos (page 58).

Setup: Configure various settings (page 61).

Note

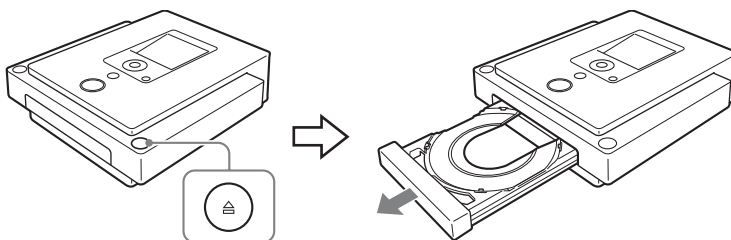
When connecting an HDD or DVD camcorder to the VIDEO IN or S VIDEO IN connector with an AV or S-video cable respectively, select [DV Camcorder/Video ➡ DVD].

Inserting a Disc

To insert a disc, perform the following while the DVDirect is turned on.

1 Press the (Eject) button.

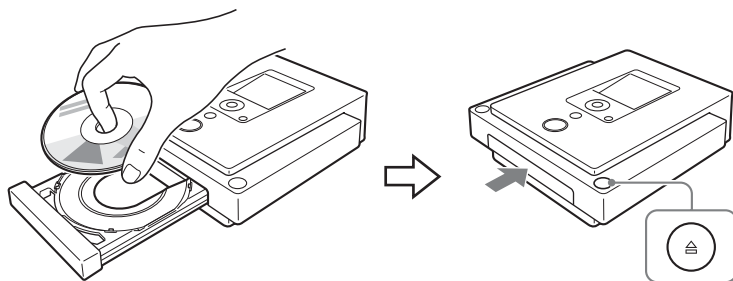
The disc tray ejects.



2 Place the disc in the disc tray with its label facing up, and press the (Eject) button again.

Notes

- Do not touch the recording side of the disc.
- When inserting the disc, make sure it rests flat under the four tabs on the disc tray.



When the  (Eject) button is pressed again, the disc tray closes and the DVDirect starts reading the inserted disc.

When a new disc is inserted

When a new disc is inserted, the disc will be formatted automatically. If the new disc inserted is a DVD+R disc, a message prompting you to select an input source appears.



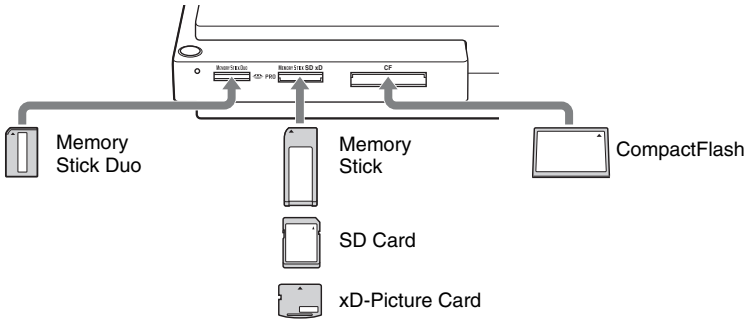
To continue with operations, press **↑** or **↓** to select a source to record from, and press the **○** (Select) button.

Note

- If a disc that cannot be recorded on is inserted, an indication message appears. If this occurs, confirm all the compatible discs and replace the disc.

Inserting a Memory Card

Insert the memory card into its corresponding memory card slot.



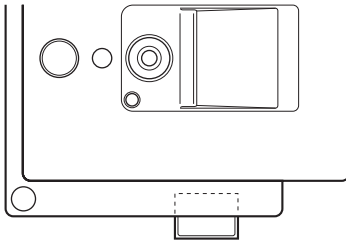
Memory Stick Duo
Push the “Memory Stick Duo” into the slot until you hear a click. To remove, push the “Memory Stick Duo” and pull out.

Memory Stick/SD Card/xD-Picture Card
Push the card into the slot until you hear a click. To remove, push the card and pull out.

CompactFlash
Push the card into the CompactFlash slot. To remove, pull out the CompactFlash card.

Notes

- Insert only one memory card into a memory card slot. Furthermore, do not use more than one memory card slot at a time.
- Do not insert another memory card while recording onto a disc is in progress. Doing so may cause a writing error.
- Do not insert a “Memory Stick Duo” with a Memory Stick Duo adaptor into the multi memory card slot.
- The CompactFlash card stays half exposed.



- Never remove the memory card while the memory card LED is lit. Otherwise data in the memory card may be damaged.
- Do not remove the memory card while recording onto a disc.

Creating a Video DVD

You can use the DVDirect as a stand-alone DVD recorder to burn videos directly onto DVDs from a connected HDD, DVD, or DV camcorder or video device such as a VCR or DVR.

You can play the created video DVD on other DVD devices or the DVD drives of computers.

Types of Recording

Five types of recording are available for creating video DVDs: DVD BURN, Full Recording, Incremental Recording, Consolidation Recording, and Normal Video Recording.

DVD BURN (One Touch Recording Through HDD Camcorder Control) (page 28)

This mode allows you to record video from an HDD camcorder onto a disc by simply pressing the DVD BURN button on the camera or Handycam Station (or touching the [DVD BURN] button in the camera's LCD screen).

The actual recording process is the same as that of Incremental Recording (see below), and you can record additional video onto a disc that has been previously recorded on.

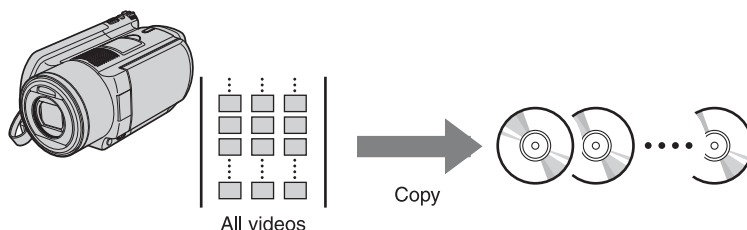
Full Recording (One touch recording) (page 31)

This mode allows you to record video from a digital video camera connected to the DVDirect with a single touch of the  (Record) button onto a DVD.

The video is recorded as follows:

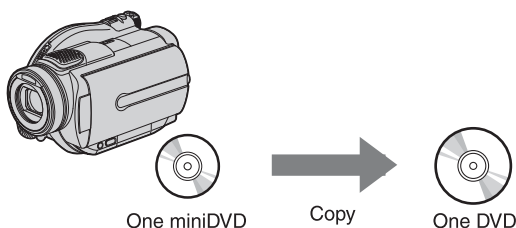
HDD camcorder

The entire video content of the camera is recorded onto a disc. (Several discs may be required depending on the length of the video.)



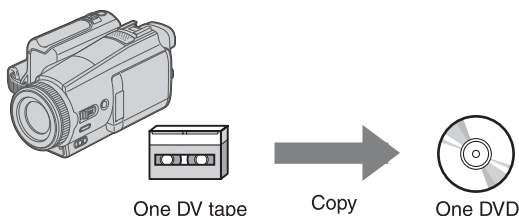
DVD camcorder

The entire video content of the camera's 8-cm disc is recorded onto a 12-cm disc.



DV camcorder

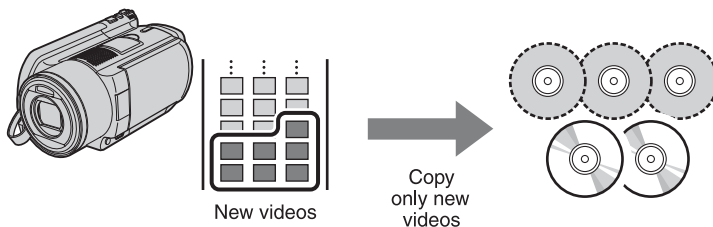
The entire content of the videotape is recorded onto a single disc.



The DVDirect controls the camera during the entire process, and completes creation of the video DVD. The completed DVD is automatically finalized, allowing immediate playback on DVD players.

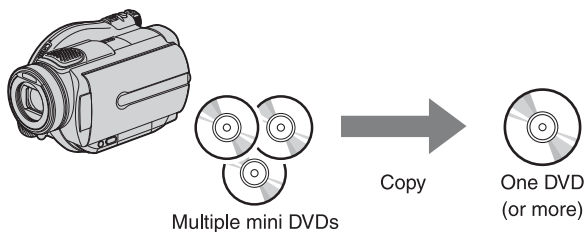
Incremental Recording (page 35)

This mode allows you to record the content of an HDD camcorder connected via a USB cable onto a disc. Using this mode, you can record only the newly taken contents of a camera whose previous contents have already been recorded onto a disc.



Consolidation Recording (page 39)

This mode allows you to record the contents of multiple 8-cm discs from a DVD camcorder onto the corresponding number of 12-cm discs.



Normal Video Recording (page 42)

This mode allows you to create a video DVD using the  (Record) and  (Stop) buttons on the DVDirect and the play, pause, and stop buttons on the device connected to the DVDirect. You can record from any video device with a video output connector.



Supported Camcorders/Video Devices and Recording Modes

¹⁾ Camcorders equipped with HD (AVCHD) format are not supported.

²⁾ Operation compatibility is confirmed with Sony DV, D8, and HDV camcorders only.

Notes on presetting camcorders

- The “USB SPEED” setting on HDD and DVD camcorders must be set to “AUTO.” (“AUTO” is the default setting.)
- The “A/V → DV OUT” setting on DV camcorders must be set to “OFF.” (“OFF” is the default setting.)

Notes on time required for recording

When recording from an HDD or DVD camcorder connected via USB cable, the length of time required depends on the REC mode (HQ, SP, or LP) used to shoot the video and the number of scenes the video contains. In general, videos shot in higher image quality modes take longer to be recorded onto a disc. The following provides a general estimate* of the time required to record a 1-hour video containing one scene onto a disc.

When recording from an HDD camcorder

HQ mode: about 30 min (1/2 of the video playback length)

SP mode: about 20 min (1/3 of the video playback length)

LP mode: about 10 min (1/6 of the video playback length)

When recording from a DVD camcorder

HQ mode: about 60 min (almost equal to the video playback length)

SP mode: about 40 min (2/3 of the video playback length)

LP mode: about 20 min (1/3 of the video playback length)

* Depending on circumstances, the length of time required to record may be equal to or more than the video playback length.



Notes on creating video DVDs

- You cannot record videos with copy-protected signals (commercial DVDs, VHS software, some programs from satellite or CATV receivers, etc.).
- You cannot make incremental recordings on discs that have been created using a computer or other DVD recorder.
- When adding video to a video DVD created using a DVD+R disc, you must use the same interface used during the previous recording to connect the video device and the DVDirect. For example, you cannot add video from a DVD camcorder connected via an S-video or video input cable onto a DVD+R disc with video dubbed from a DVD camcorder that was connected via a USB cable.
- When recording video from an HDD camcorder onto a disc, only the video images stored in the camera are available for recording. You cannot record both the video and still images stored in the camera onto a disc at the same time.
- When using a DVD camcorder, recording is not possible when the disc inside the DVD camcorder is a DVD-RW disc with video recorded in DVD-VR format.

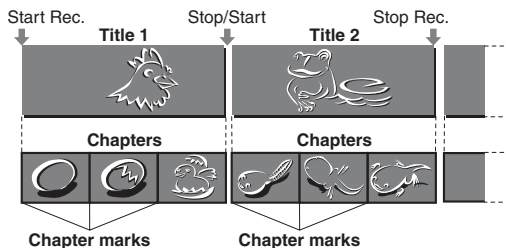
Titles and chapters

The contents of a DVD consist of sections, called titles, and smaller sub-sections, called chapters. When you create a video DVD with the DVDirect, titles and chapters are created as follows:

For discs created through normal video recording or recording from DV camcorders connected via DV (i.LINK) cable

Titles are created between the points where you start and stop a recording on the DVDirect.

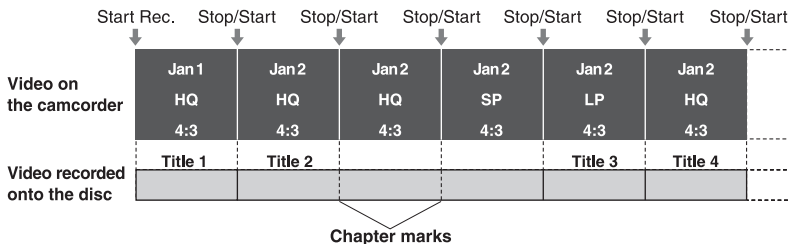
Chapters are created according to the [Auto Chaptering] setting configured in the Setup menu (page 63).



For discs created through recording from HDD or DVD camcorders connected via USB cable

Titles are created at points in the video where the date recorded, REC mode (from HQ or SP to LP or vice versa), and aspect ratio (from 4:3 to 16:9 or vice versa) change.

Chapters are created for each scene taken with the HDD or DVD camcorder. (Scenes are created each time recording is started and then stopped.)



Note

Up to 49 titles per disc and 99 chapters per title can be created. This number may decrease depending on the quality of the videos.

DVD menus

A DVD menu is displayed each time a DVD is inserted into a DVD player and serves as a title page or table of contents for the video DVD.

You can create DVDs that display thumbnail images of titles in their menu screens. You can select from four different menu styles when creating video DVDs with the DVDirect (page 63).



One Touch Recording Through HDD Camcorder Control (DVD BURN)



You can create video DVDs from your HDD camcorder simply by pressing the camera's [DVD BURN] button.

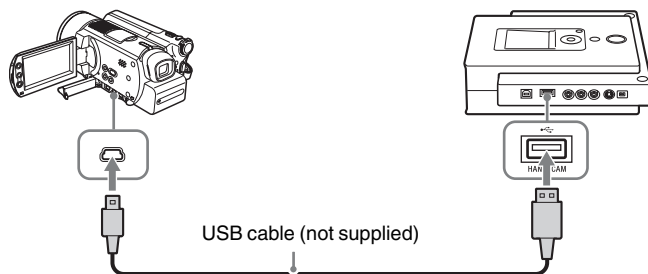
- 1 Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDDirect.
A message prompting you to insert a disc appears in the display window.
- 2 Insert a disc (page 17).
The DVDDirect starts reading the inserted disc.

Hint

When a new DVD+R disc is inserted, a message prompting you to select an input source to record from appears. You do not need to make a selection here as this message will disappear and recording will start automatically when you press the [DVD BURN] button in step 5.

- 3 Turn on the HDD camcorder.
- 4 Connect the camera to the DVDDirect.

Connect the camera's USB connector (Type mini B) to the DVDDirect's USB connector (Type A) using a USB cable (not supplied).

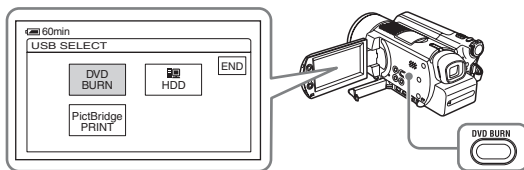


Note

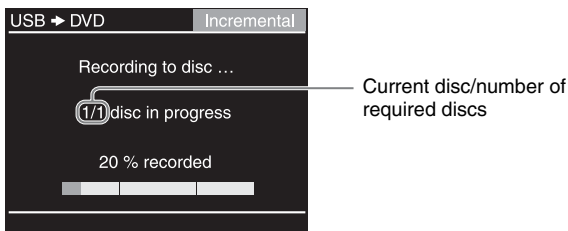
The USB cable supplied with the DVDDirect cannot be used to connect to an HDD or DVD camcorder as the shape of the camera's connector is different.

After connecting the USB cable, the USB SELECT screen appears in the camera's LCD screen.

- 5 Touch [DVD BURN] on the camera's LCD screen, or press the DVD BURN button on the camera or Handycam Station.



Recording starts, and the progress appears in the display window.



When all of the content of the HDD camcorder is recorded, recording automatically stops and the  (Record) button dims. Press the RETURN button to go back to the main menu.

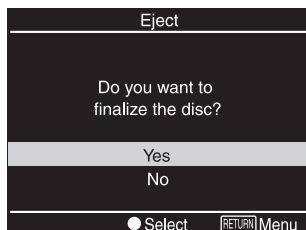
Note

When the contents of the HDD camcorder do not fit on a single disc, the disc will be finalized once it becomes full, and a message will appear in the display window. Remove the completed disc, and insert a blank disc. Recording will resume automatically.



6 Press the (Eject) button.

A message asking whether to finalize the disc just recorded on appears.



7 Select whether to finalize the disc.

For details on finalizing discs, see “What is ‘finalize disc’?” (page 66).

To finalize the disc:

Select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button. A confirmation message will appear, so select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button again. Disc finalization will begin, and the process may take a few minutes.

When finalization is finished, the disc is ejected and the video DVD is completed. You can now play the disc on DVD players or the DVD drives of computers.

To not finalize the disc:

Select [No] and press the  (Select) button. The disc will be ejected without finalization. This disc is not completed yet, and it cannot be played with other DVD players or DVD drives of computers.

Hint

If you eject a disc without finalizing after videos have been recorded, you can add videos onto the same disc later.

To stop recording

You cannot stop while recording is in progress. You can only stop recording by pressing the  (Stop) button after a disc becomes full.

Note on recording with the DVD BURN button

This function is only available when the DVDDirect is in the following states:

- no button on the DVDDirect is pressed after the power is turned on
- the main menu appears in the display window

One Touch Recording (Full Recording)



When an HDD, DVD, or DV camcorder is connected to the DVDirect, you can use Full Recording to record the video contents of the camera onto a disc with a single touch of a button.

- 1 Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDirect.

A message prompting you to insert a disc appears in the display window.

- 2 Insert a disc (page 17).

The DVDirect starts reading the inserted disc.

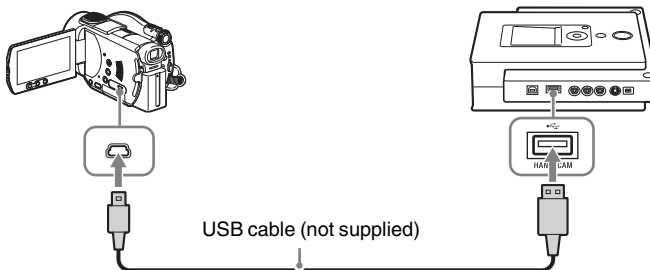
- 3 Turn on the camera, and set it to playback mode.

For most cameras, switch the power/mode button to the playback, PLAY/EDIT, or VTR mode to play the video or perform recording. For details, refer to the operating instructions for your camera.

- 4 Connect the camera to the DVDirect.

When using an HDD or DVD camcorder

Connect the camera's USB connector (Type mini B) to the DVDirect's USB connector (Type A) using a USB cable (not supplied).



Note

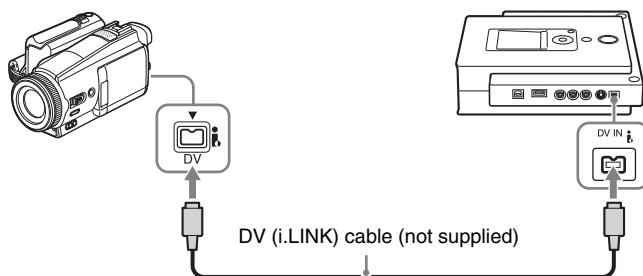
The USB cable supplied with the DVDirect cannot be used to connect to an HDD or DVD camcorder as the shape of the camera's connector is different.

After connecting the USB cable, the USB SELECT screen appears in the camera's LCD screen. Move on to the next step.



When using a DV camcorder

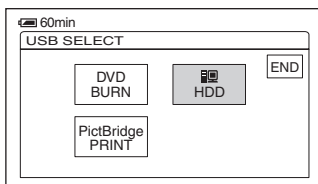
Connect the camera's DV connector to the DVDirect's DV IN connector using a DV (i.LINK) cable (not supplied).



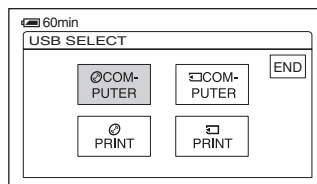
After connecting the camera, skip to step 6.

- 5 Touch [HDD] (for an HDD camcorder) or [COMPUTER] (for a DVD camcorder) on the camera's LCD screen.

Once you touch the button on the camera's LCD screen, the DVDirect detects the connected camera, and the display window on the DVDirect changes.

Note

Depending on the DVD camcorder you are using, the above USB SELECT screen may not appear automatically and settings configuration for USB connection may be required beforehand. Refer to the section on connecting to computers in the operating instructions for your camcorder when configuring settings on the camcorder.



6 Press **←** or **→** to switch the recording mode.

Pressing **←** or **→** switches the recording mode displayed at the top right of the display window. For Full Recording, press **←** or **→** until [Full] displays.

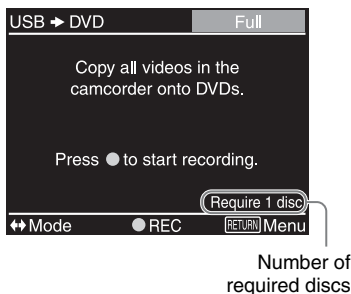

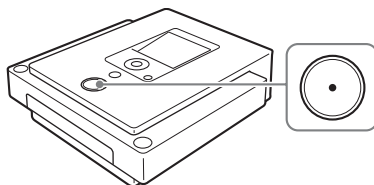

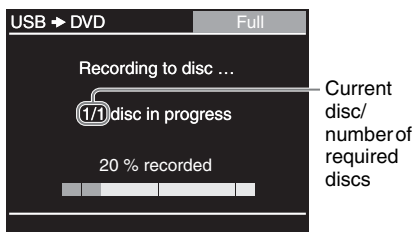

7 Press the (Record) button to start recording.



The DVDirect starts recording at the same time the camera starts playback or file transfer. [Recording] appears in the display window, and the  (Record) button lights up during recording.



Hint

When using a DV camcorder and the video tape is not at its beginning, the tape is automatically rewound and played back from the beginning before the DVDirect starts recording.

When using an HDD camcorder

When the contents of the HDD camcorder do not fit onto a single disc, a disc will be finalized once it becomes full, and a message will appear in the display window. Remove the completed disc, and insert a blank disc. Recording will resume automatically.



When using a DV camcorder.

When a blank portion of the DV tape is reached, recording automatically stops and the  (Record) button dims.

When recording is complete, the disc is automatically ejected. The video DVD is completed, and you can now play it on DVD players or the DVD drives of computers.

To stop recording

When using an HDD camcorder

You cannot stop while recording is in progress. You can only stop recording by pressing the  (Stop) button after a disc becomes full.

When using a DVD camcorder

You cannot stop while recording is in progress.

When using a DV camcorder

Press the  (Stop) button. Playback on the DV camcorder will also stop automatically.

Incremental Recording

After the video contents of an HDD camcorder are recorded onto a disc, additional video taken with the same HDD camcorder can be recorded onto a disc without recording the previous contents again.

- 1 Press the (Power) button to turn on the DVDirect.

A message prompting you to insert a disc appears in the display window.

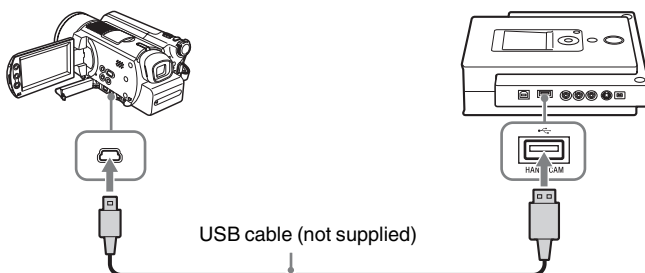
- 2 Insert a disc (page 17).

The DVDirect starts reading the inserted disc.

- 3 Turn on the HDD camcorder, and set it to PLAY/EDIT mode.

- 4 Connect the camera to the DVDirect.

Connect the camera's USB connector (Type mini B) to the DVDirect's USB connector (Type A) using a USB cable (not supplied).

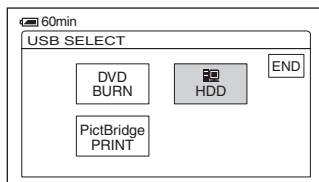


Note

The USB cable supplied with the DVDirect cannot be used to connect to an HDD or DVD camcorder as the shape of the camera's connector is different.

After connecting the USB cable, the USB SELECT screen appears in the camera's LCD screen.

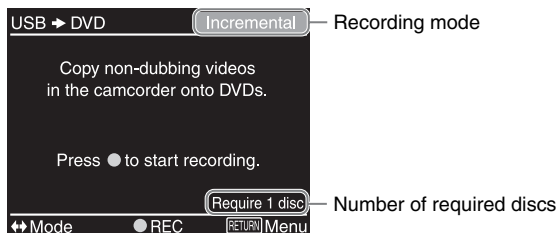
- 5 Touch [HDD] on the camera's LCD screen.



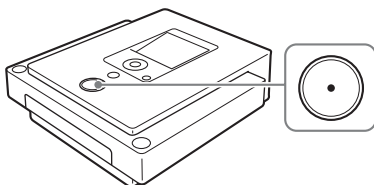
Once you touch [HDD], the DVDirect detects the connected camera, and the display window on the DVDirect changes.

6 Press ← or → to switch the recording mode.

Pressing ← or → switches the recording mode displayed in the top right of the display window. For Incremental Recording, press ← or → until [Incremental] displays.

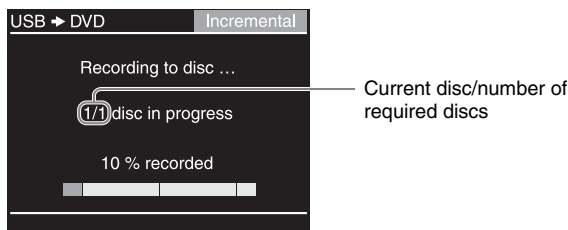


7 Press the ● (Record) button to start recording.



Recording begins for the portion of the camera's video content recorded after the previous burning to disc.

During recording, the progress appears in the display window.



When all of the new content of the HDD camcorder is recorded, recording automatically stops and the ● (Record) button dims. Press the RETURN button to go back to the main menu.

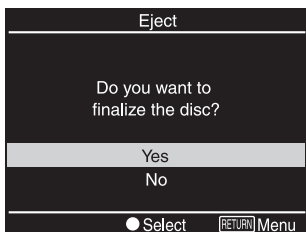
Notes

- If the HDD camcorder does not contain new video (all of the video contents have already been recorded onto a DVD), Incremental Recording is not available. In such a case, only Full Recording is available.
- When the contents of the HDD camcorder do not fit on a single disc, the disc will be finalized once it becomes full, and a message will appear in the display window. Remove the completed disc, and insert a blank disc. Recording will resume automatically.



8 Press the (Eject) button.

A message asking whether to finalize the disc just recorded on appears.



9 Select whether to finalize the disc.

For details on finalizing discs, see “What is ‘finalize disc’?” (page 66).

To finalize the disc:

Select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button. A confirmation message will appear, so select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button again. Disc finalization will begin, and the process may take a few minutes.

When finalization is finished, the disc is ejected and the video DVD is completed. You can now play the disc on DVD players or the DVD drives of computers.

To not finalize the disc:

Select [No] and press the  (Select) button. The disc will be ejected without finalization. This disc is not completed yet, and it cannot be played with other DVD players or DVD drives of computers.

Hint

If you eject a disc without finalizing after videos have been recorded, you can add videos onto the same disc later.

To stop recording

You cannot stop while recording is in progress. You can only stop recording by pressing the  (Stop) button after a disc becomes full.

Note on Incremental Recording

Always use the  (Power) button to turn off the DVDirect after Incremental Recording is finished. If you turn off the power by pulling out the AC power cord, the DVDirect will not be able to detect newly taken video properly, and Incremental Recording will not be possible the next time you attempt to perform it.

Consolidation Recording

When you have multiple 8-cm discs containing video taken with a DVD camcorder, you can consolidate and record the video onto the corresponding number of 12-cm discs.

- 1 Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDDirect.

A message prompting you to insert a disc appears in the display window.

- 2 Insert a disc (page 17).

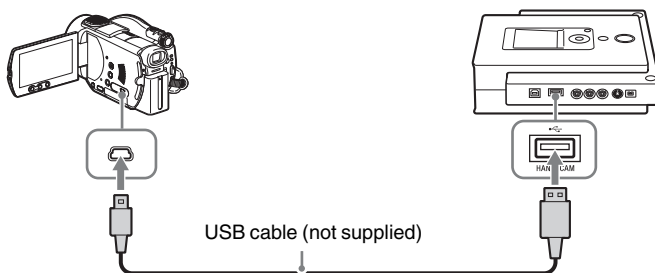
The DVDDirect starts reading the inserted disc.

- 3 Turn on the camera, and set it to playback mode.

For most cameras, switch the power/mode button to the playback or PLAY/EDIT mode to perform recording. For details, refer to the operating instructions for your camera.

- 4 Connect the DVD camcorder to the DVDDirect.

Connect the camera's USB connector (Type mini B) to the DVDDirect's USB connector (Type A) using a USB cable (not supplied).

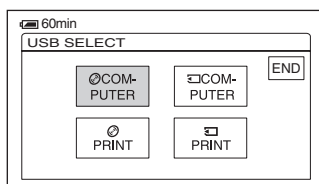


Note

The USB cable supplied with the DVDDirect cannot be used to connect to an HDD or DVD camcorder as the shape of the camera's connector is different.

After connecting the USB cable, the USB SELECT screen appears in the camera's LCD screen.

- 5 Touch  [COMPUTER] on the camera's LCD screen.



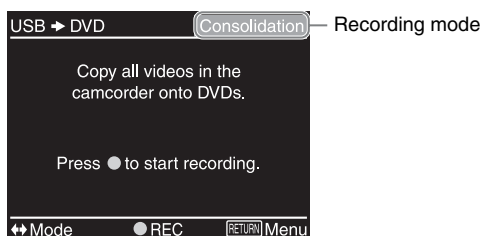
Once you touch [COMPUTER], the DVDDirect detects the connected camera, and the display window on the DVDDirect changes.

Note

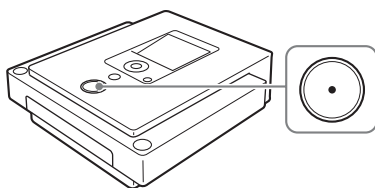
Depending on the DVD camcorder you are using, the above USB SELECT screen may not appear automatically and settings configuration for USB connection may be required beforehand. Refer to the section on connecting to computers in the operating instructions for your camcorder when configuring settings on the camcorder.

6 Press ← or → to switch the recording mode.

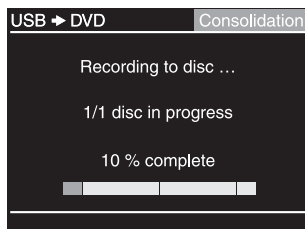
Pressing ← or → switches the recording mode displayed in the top right of the display window. For Consolidation Recording, press ← or → until [Consolidation] displays.



7 Press the ● (Record) button to start recording.



During recording, the progress appears in the display window.



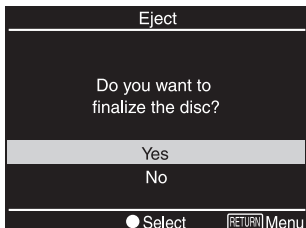
Recording automatically stops and the ● (Record) button dims. Press the RETURN button to go back to the main menu.

Hint

To consolidate the video contents of another 8-cm disc onto the current disc, replace the 8-cm disc in the DVD camcorder with the other 8-cm disc, and press the ● (Record) button on the DVDDirect.

8 Press the (Eject) button.

A message asking whether to finalize the disc just recorded on appears.



9 Select whether to finalize the disc.

For details on finalizing discs, see “What is ‘finalize disc’?” (page 66).

To finalize the disc:

Select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button. A confirmation message will appear, so select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button again. Disc finalization will begin, and the process may take a few minutes.

When finalization is finished, the disc is ejected and the video DVD is completed. You can now play the disc on DVD players or the DVD drives of computers.

To not finalize the disc:

Select [No] and press the  (Select) button. The disc will be ejected without finalization. This disc is not completed yet, and it cannot be played with other DVD players or DVD drives of computers.

Hint

If you eject a disc without finalizing after videos have been recorded, you can consolidate videos recorded on other 8-cm DVDs onto the same disc later.

Note

You cannot stop while recording is in progress. Wait until it stops automatically.

Normal Video Recording



To burn video from a video device such as a VCR or DVR onto a disc, connect the device to the DVDirect via an S-video or AV cable. Operate the video device to play back the portion you want to record, and use the  (Record) and  (Stop) buttons on the DVDirect to record. You can use the same operation to record from a DV camcorder connected to the DVDirect via a DV (i.LINK) cable.

- 1 Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDirect.

A message prompting you to insert a disc appears in the display window.

- 2 Insert a disc (page 17).

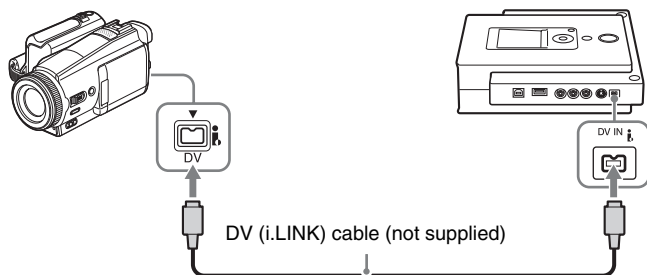
The DVDirect starts reading the inserted disc.

- 3 Turn on the camera or video device, and set it to playback mode.

For most cameras, switch the power/mode button to the playback, PLAY/EDIT, or VTR mode to play the tape or perform recording. For details, refer to the operating instructions for your camera.

- 4 Connect the camera or video device to the DVDirect.

When connecting a DV camcorder using a DV (i.LINK) cable
Connect the camera's DV connector to the DVDirect's DV IN connector using a DV (i.LINK) cable (not supplied).



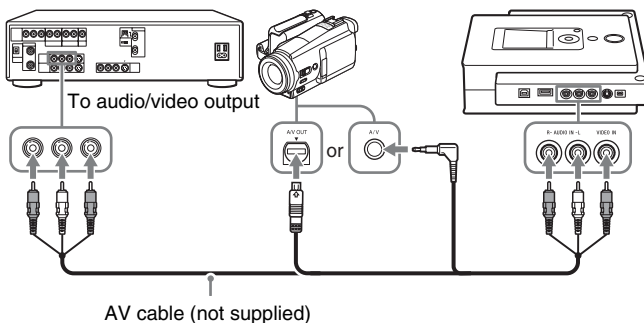
When connecting a video device using an AV or S-video cable
Use an AV or S-video cable (both not supplied) when connecting a video device such as a VCR or DVR to the DVDirect.

Note

Regardless of which of the two cables is used, recording is always performed with normal video recording.

For AV cables:

Connect the video device's audio/video output connectors to the DVDirect's AUDIO IN/VIDEO IN connectors using the AV cable (not supplied).

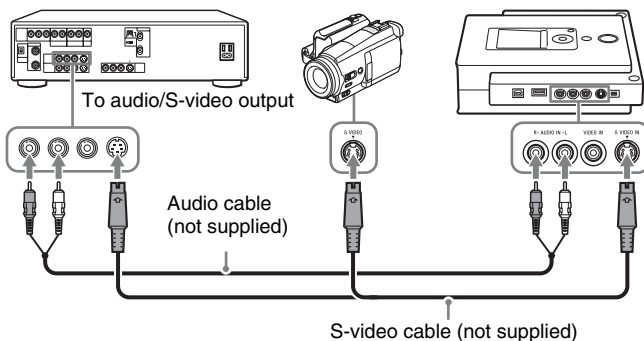


Hint

The connectors on a video device differ depending on the device. Refer to the operating instructions for your device, and use the appropriate AV cable.

For S-video cables:

Connect the video device's S-video out connector to the DVDirect's S VIDEO IN connector using the S-video cable (not supplied). You must also connect an audio cable for audio input.



Hint

If your video device has an S-video connector, use an S-video cable for improved picture quality (compared to video cable quality).

- 5 Operate the camera or video device to start playback of video.
The following appears in the DVDDirect's display window.



Hint

The DVDDirect detects and selects video input signals automatically when you play back video from the connected video device. You can view the video playback in the display window with the selected input source displayed in the top left.

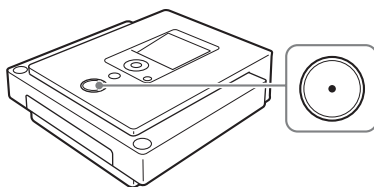
DV → DVD : DV IN is detected.

Video → DVD : VIDEO IN is detected.

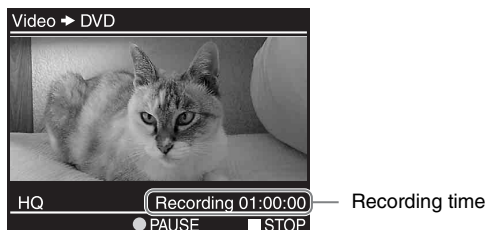
S-Video → DVD : S VIDEO IN is detected.

If the correct input source is not selected (or if the video playback does not display), press **↑** or **↓** to select the correct input manually.

- 6 Press the **⊙** (Record) button to start recording.



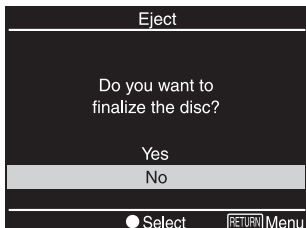
Dubbing from the camera or video device starts. During recording, [Recording] appears in the display window as the video is played back.



Note

If you stop playback on the camera or video device during recording (or the video signal is interrupted), the DVDDirect pauses recording and the **⊙** (Record) button flashes slowly. To resume recording, restart playback on the video device. If no video signal is detected for 2 minutes, recording stops.

- 7 Press the  (Stop) button to stop recording.
Wait a moment until the display window changes.
- 8 To record additional video, repeat steps 5 to 7.
- 9 When you are finished recording, press the RETURN button to go back to the main menu, and press the  (Eject) button.
A message asking whether to finalize the disc just recorded on appears.



Hint

This message will not appear when using a DVD+RW disc. (DVD+RW discs are automatically finalized and ejected.)

10 Select whether to finalize the disc.

For details on finalizing discs, see “What is ‘finalize disc’?” (page 66).

To finalize the disc:

Select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button. A confirmation message will appear, so select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button again. Disc finalization will begin, and the process may take a few minutes.

When finalization is finished, the disc is ejected and the video DVD is completed. You can now play the disc on DVD players or the DVD drives of computers.

To not finalize the disc:

Select [No] and press the  (Select) button. The disc will be ejected without finalization. This disc is not completed yet, and it cannot be played on other DVD players or the DVD drives of computers.

Previewing a Video DVD

You can play back and check a video DVD burned with the DVDirect in the display window on the top of the unit.

Notes

- Sound cannot be heard when previewing the disc on the DVDirect.
- You cannot output video images to external devices such as TVs.
- You cannot play back a disc recorded on a device other than the DVDirect or with commercial DVD software.

1 Press the (Power) button to turn on the DVDirect.

The display window turns on.

2 Press to display the main menu. Press or to select [DVD Video Preview], and then press the (Select) button.



3 Insert a video DVD created with the DVDirect.

After the disc is finished being read, its contents are displayed in the display window.

When a finalized disc is inserted:

The video titles recorded on the disc appear in the display window.

Press , , , or  to select the title you want to view, and press the  (Select) button. The selected title starts to play. To stop playback, press the  (Stop) button.



When a disc that has not been finalized is inserted:
The last title on the disc starts to play automatically.



Current title number/total title number

Press ◀ or ▶ to select the title you want to view. To stop playback, press the ■ (Stop) button.

Hints

- When a DVD+RW disc is inserted, the video titles appear in the display window, as in the case of finalized discs.
- If you insert a finalized video DVD immediately after turning on the DVDDirect, auto setup navigation activates and the video titles recorded on the disc appear in the display window automatically.
- For details on titles, see “Titles and chapters” (page 26).



Creating a Photo DVD

You can easily record photos taken with your digital camera from a memory card onto a DVD. You can also create a slideshow DVDs.

Still images stored on an HDD camcorder can also be recorded onto a disc.

Notes

- When recording still images from an HDD camcorder onto a disc, only the still images stored in the camera are available for recording. You cannot record both the video and still images stored in the camera onto a disc at the same time.
- Still images taken with a DVD camcorder and stored on an 8-cm disc cannot be recorded onto a disc with the DVDirect.

Types of Recording

Two types of recording are available for creating photo DVDs: all photo recording and photo select recording.

All photo recording

This method allows you to select at once all of the photos (taken with a digital camera) stored on a memory card or all of the photos on the hard disk of an HDD camcorder and record them onto a DVD with one touch. (Up to 2000 photos can be recorded.)

Photo select recording

This method allows you to select only the photos (taken with a digital camera) that you want to record from a memory card and record them onto a disc.

Types of Photo DVD

The following types of photo DVD can be created with the DVDirect. You can decide which to create at a message prompt that appears when ejecting the disc.

Photo backup DVD (page 51, 54)

Photo backup DVDs allow you to store photos (JPEG files) taken with a digital camera or HDD camcorder on a DVD disc. You can view the photo backup DVD created with the DVDirect in the display window or view it using the DVD drive of a computer.

Slideshow DVD (page 53, 56)

In addition to storing photos (JPEG files) taken with a digital camera or HDD camcorder, slideshow DVDs allow you to view these photos as a slideshow. You can play the slideshow DVD with commercial DVD players and even include background music.

**Note**

The picture quality of the photos played back in a slideshow is equivalent to that of video DVDs.

Supported Memory Cards and Camcorders

The recording methods available differ as follows, depending on the type of camera or storage device connected to the DVDirect.

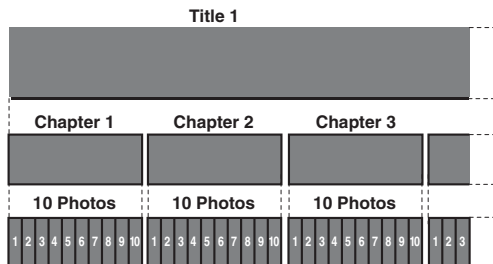

About Created Photo DVDs

Slideshow DVDs

The contents of a DVD consist of sections, called titles, and smaller sub-sections, called chapters. When you create a slideshow DVD with the DVDDirect, a chapter is created for every 10 photos as shown in the following.



Note

Up to 99 chapters per title can be created. This number may decrease depending on the quality of the photos.

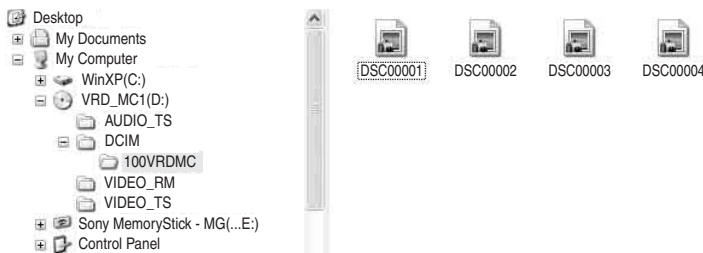
You can select from four different tunes for background music when creating slideshow DVDs with the DVDDirect (page 63).

As with video DVDs, you can also select from four different menu styles when creating slideshow DVDs (page 63).

Storage locations on photo DVDs

The following shows the folders and files of a photo DVD as shown on a computer screen.

All photos are stored in the folder "100VRDMC."



Hint

File names are automatically created when the photo DVD is created.

Recording Photos Stored on a Memory Card

- 1 Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDirect.
A message prompting you to insert a disc appears in the display window.
- 2 Insert a disc (page 17).
The DVDirect starts reading the inserted disc.
- 3 Insert the memory card into its corresponding memory card slot (page 19).

The photos stored on the memory card are displayed in the display window.

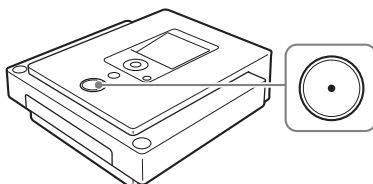


- 4 If you do not want to record all of the photos on the memory card, remove the check marks from the photos you do not want to record.

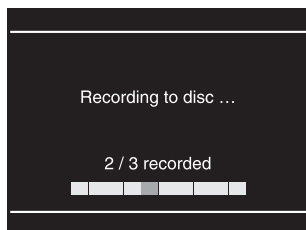
The check marks on the thumbnails indicate photos that will be recorded. All of the thumbnails are checked when the photos are first loaded from the memory card. If you want to record only a portion of the photos, remove some of the check marks.

- 1) Press  or  to scroll through the photos.
- 2) Select a photo and press the  (Select) button to remove the check mark.
- 3) Press the  (Select) button again to put the check mark back.

- 5 Press the  (Record) button to start recording.



During recording, the progress appears in the display window, and the  (Record) button remains lit.



Note

Do not insert another memory card while recording onto a disc is in progress. Doing so may cause a writing error.

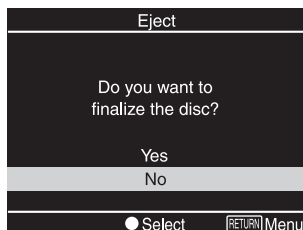
When all of the photos are recorded onto the disc, recording automatically stops, and the  (Record) button dims. Press the RETURN button to go back to the main menu.

Hint

You can continue to add photos from another memory card onto the same disc. To do this, change the memory card and press the  (Record) button after the new photos are displayed in the display window.

6 Press the (Eject) button.

A message asking whether to finalize the disc just recorded on appears.



Hint

This message will not appear when using a DVD+RW disc.

7 Select whether to finalize the disc.

For details on finalizing discs, see “What is ‘finalize disc’?” (page 66).

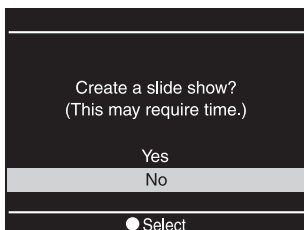
To finalize the disc:

Select [Yes] and press  (Select) button. A confirmation message will appear, so select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button again. A message asking whether to create a slideshow appears. Move on to the next step.

To not finalize the disc:

Select [No] and press  (Select) button. The disc will be ejected without finalization. This disc is not completed yet, and it cannot be played with other DVD players or DVD drives of computers.

8 Select whether to create a slideshow.



Press  or  to select whether to create a slideshow, and press the  (Select) button.

To complete the disc as a photo backup DVD, select [No].

To complete the disc as a slideshow DVD, select [Yes].

Notes

- When a slideshow is created on a disc, you cannot record additional photos onto the same disc.
- It takes a few minutes to complete finalizing for a photo backup DVD. The amount of time it takes to complete a slideshow DVD depends on the number and size of the photos. (For example, it may take 20 minutes or more to record 100 files (5-megapixel photos) onto a DVD.)

When you press the  (Select) button, the disc is processed according to your selections in steps 7 and 8. When all of the processing is complete, the disc is ejected and the photo DVD is complete.

To record more photos

If you eject a disc after recording photos without finalizing, you can add photos on the same disc later. Insert the disc and the memory card with additional photos into the DVDirect, and then repeat from step 4.

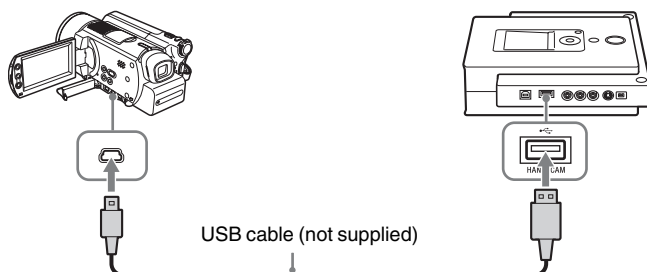
To create a slideshow DVD with a single button touch

When [Slideshow Creation] is set to [ON] in the Setup menu (page 64), the disc is finalized and a slideshow is created on the disc automatically after recording the photos. The procedures from steps 6 to 8 are processed automatically, and the slideshow DVD is complete.

Recording Photos Stored on an HDD Camcorder

- 1 Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDDirect.
A message prompting you to insert a disc appears in the display window.
- 2 Insert a disc (page 17).
The DVDDirect starts reading the inserted disc.
- 3 Press the RETURN button to display the main menu.
- 4 Press  or  to select [Photo  DVD], and then press the  (Select) button.
- 5 Press  or  to select [HDD Camcorder], and then press the  (Select) button.
- 6 Turn on the HDD camcorder, and set it to PLAY/EDIT mode.
- 7 Connect the camera to the DVDDirect.

Connect the camera's USB connector (Type mini B) to the DVDDirect's USB connector (Type A) using a USB cable (not supplied).

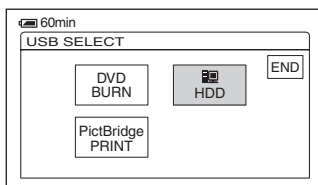


Note

Select [Yes] and press  (Select) button. A confirmation message will appear, so select [Yes] and press the  (Select) button again. A message asking whether to create a slideshow appears. Move on to the next step.

To not finalize the disc:

Select [No] and press  (Select) button. The disc will be ejected without finalization. This disc is not completed yet, and it cannot be played with other DVD players or DVD drives of computers.

12 Select whether to create a slideshow.



Press  or  to select whether to create a slideshow, and press the  (Select) button.

To complete the disc as a photo backup DVD, select [No].

To complete the disc as a slideshow DVD, select [Yes].

Notes

- When a slideshow is created on a disc, you cannot record additional photos onto such discs.
- It takes a few minutes to complete finalizing for a photo backup DVD. The amount of time it takes to complete a slideshow DVD depends on the number and size of the photos. (For example, it may take 20 minutes or more to record 100 files (5-megapixel photos) onto a DVD.)

When you press the ○ (Select) button, the disc is processed according to your selections in steps 11 and 12. When all of the processing is complete, the disc is ejected and the photo DVD is complete.

To create a slideshow DVD with a single button touch

You can create a slideshow DVD with a single touch of the ● (Record) button when [Slideshow Creation] is set to [ON] in the Setup menu (page 53, 64).



Viewing and Printing Photos

You can view and check the photos recorded on DVDs or stored on memory cards in the display window on the top panel of the DVDDirect. You can also print these photos by connecting the DVDDirect to a PictBridge-compatible printer.

Note

You cannot output the photo images to external devices such as TVs.

- 1 Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDDirect.
- 2 Insert the memory card or disc containing the photos you want to view/print.

To insert a memory card, see page 19.

To insert a photo DVD created with the DVDDirect, see page 17.

Hint

When you insert a finalized photo DVD, the auto setup function (page 15) activates and the photos on the disc will be displayed automatically. In this case, skip to step 5.

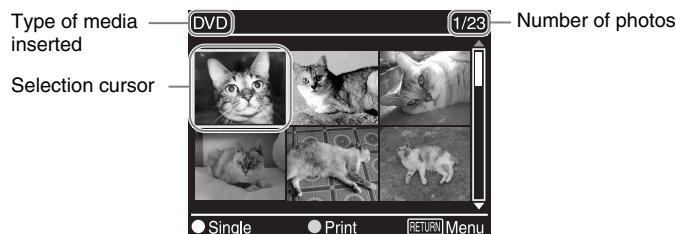
- 3 Press the RETURN button.

The main menu appears in the display window.



- 4 Press  or  to select [Photo View/Print], and then press the  (Select) button.

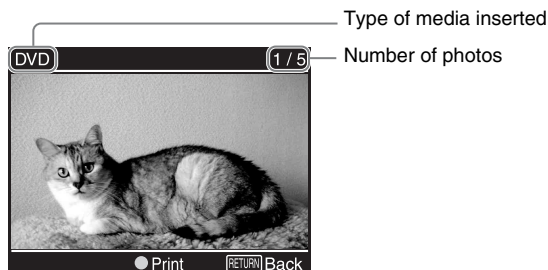
Thumbnail images of the photos stored on the inserted media appear in the display window.



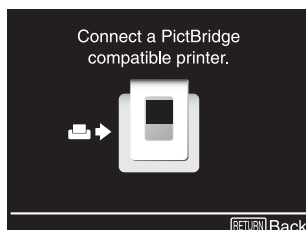
- 5 Press **↑**, **↓**, **←**, or **→** to move the selection cursor to the photo you want to view or print, and press the **○** (Select) button.
A larger display of the selected photo appears in the display window.

Hint

You can also print images directly from the thumbnail display screen. To do this, skip to step 6 after moving the cursor to the photo you want to print.

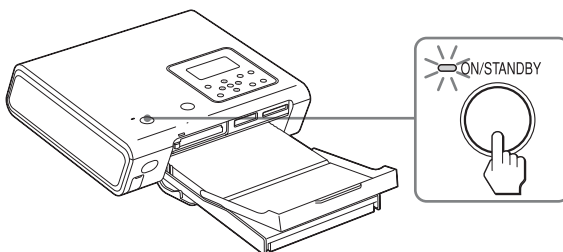

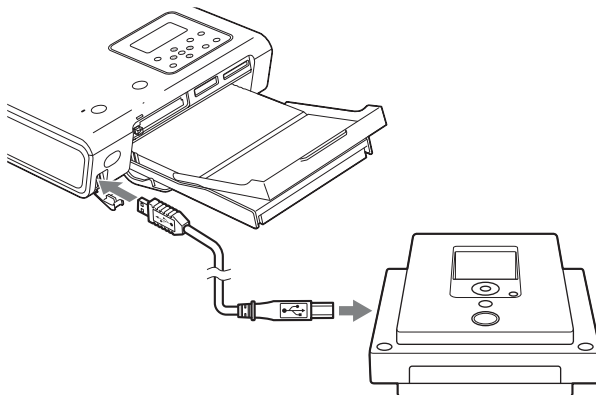

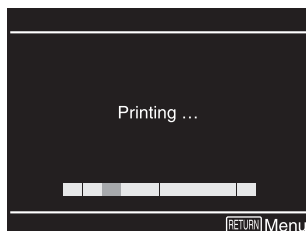

- 8 Connect your printer to the DVDDirect using the supplied USB cable.



The printer starts printing.



The message [Printing] will disappear when printing is finished.

Hint

To continue printing other photos, press **↑**, **↓**, **←**, or **→** to scroll and display the photo you want to print, and then press the **○** (Record) button.

Notes on viewing and printing photos

- You cannot view or print photos from a photo DVD created on a device other than the DVDDirect (such as a computer).
- You can view and print JPEG-format photos taken with digital still cameras. Any other photo files (JPEG files created, edited, or finished on a computer for example) are not guaranteed to display or print using the DVDDirect.

Using the Setup Menu

You can change the various settings for creating discs in the Setup menu screen.

The following procedure displays the Setup menu.

- 1** Press the  (Power) button to turn on the DVDirect.

The display window turns on.

- 2** Press the RETURN button.

The main menu appears.



Hint

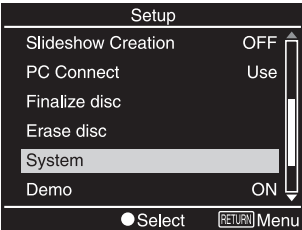
Whenever [RETURN] is displayed in the bottom left during operation of the DVDirect, the main menu returns when you press the RETURN button.

- 3** Press  to select [Setup], and press the  (Select) button.

The Setup menu appears.



Move the cursor by pressing **↑** or **↓** to select items or options to change, and press the **○** (Select) button to confirm.



Rec Quality

Select the recording quality to use when creating a video DVD. This setting only applies to Full Recording (DV camcorder) and Normal Video Recording modes.

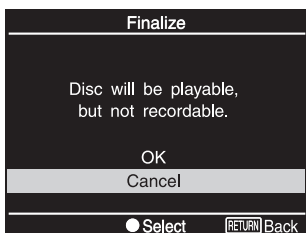

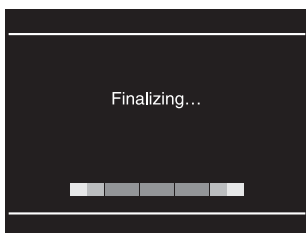

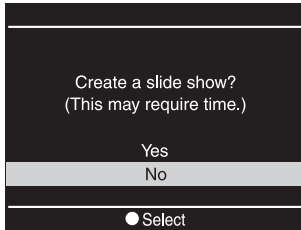

To complete the disc as a photo backup DVD, select [No].

To complete the disc as a slideshow DVD, select [Yes].

Notes

- It takes a few minutes to complete finalizing for a video DVD or photo backup DVD.
- The amount of time it takes to complete a slideshow DVD depends on the number and size of the photos. (For example, it may take 20 minutes or more to record 100 files (5-megapixel photos) onto a DVD.)

After finalizing is completed, the disc can be ejected.

What is “finalize disc”?

To finalize the disc means to make the created disc playable on other DVD devices.

When ejecting a disc immediately after recording, the DVDDirect asks you if you want to finalize the disc or not.

You can select to finalize the disc or not depending on your purpose. (You can also finalize the disc from the Setup menu (page 61)).

Generally, you complete the disc by finalizing.

The finalized disc can be used like DVD-Video or DVD-ROM discs on a DVD device.

See the following to check if finalizing is necessary for your intended purposes.

Finalize the disc

- to create a disc playable on standard DVD players.
- to create a disc readable on standard DVD drives of computers.
- to create a disc to be distributed to others.
- to create a 100% complete disc (you do not intend to add videos or photos later).

Do not finalize the disc

- when you want to add videos to the same disc with the DVDirect later.
- when you want to add photos to the same disc with the DVDirect later.
- when you are not finished creating the disc (not yet playable on other DVD devices).

The following shows the differences between a finalized disc and an unfinalized disc.

Note

When using a DVD+RW disc, finalizing is unnecessary; no message prompting finalization appears when ejecting the disc, and there is no need to finalize from the Setup menu. You can always add videos or photos on a DVD+RW disc (excluding slideshow DVDs) with the DVDirect, and the disc can always be played with a DVD player or the DVD drive of a computer.

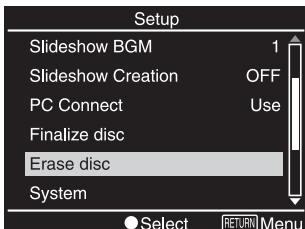
Erase disc

Available languages may differ or the setting may not be selectable depending on the country or region of use.

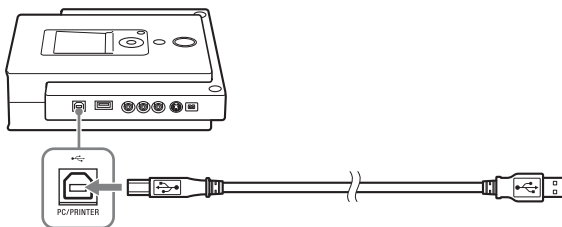

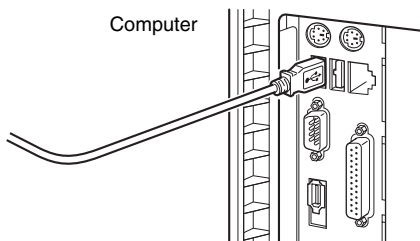

Please connect the DVDirect directly to a USB connector on the computer.



Click [My computer] and make sure the DVDirect icon has been added.
You can now use the DVDirect with your computer.

Disconnection

The disconnection procedure varies depending on your OS.

When your computer detects the DVDirect successfully,  appears on the Windows task bar. If you want to disconnect the DVDirect, you must first stop it by clicking this icon.

- 1 Click  on the task bar, and select to disconnect the DVDirect in the shortcut menu.
- 2 Follow the messages that appear, if any.
- 3 Disconnect the USB cable.

Note

If you disconnect the USB cable without performing the procedure above, your computer may operate erratically or data may be damaged. Be sure to perform the procedure above before disconnecting the USB cable.

Using Memory Card Slots

If you insert a memory card into the memory card slot when using the DVDirect as an external DVD drive, you can use the memory card as a removable disc for the computer. The memory card is displayed as a “removable disk” icon in the “My Computer” folder of the Windows display.

Notes

- Insert only one memory card into the memory card slot. Furthermore, do not use more than one memory card slot at a time.
- Do not connect the DVDirect and a USB memory card adapter to the computer at the same time, as the DVDirect may not work properly.

Using the Bundled Software

Use the bundled software to create or play back CDs and DVDs on your computer with the DVDirect.

Launching “Nero StartSmart”

Using “Nero StartSmart,” your central starting point for all your audio, video, data, backup, and recording tasks, you can choose a task from several categories, launch Nero applications, use tools, and view manuals. (Refer to the manuals or the online help for each application for details on their operation.)

To launch “Nero StartSmart,” double-click the “Nero StartSmart”  icon, or start [Nero StartSmart] from the program menu.



Move the cursor onto each icon or application to display a summary in a pop-up window. Click any of the icons or applications that you intend to use.

Notes on Using Other Software With the DVDirect

- Using software other than the bundled software (such as commercially available software, shareware, or freeware) to write data to disc with the DVDirect is not under warranty, and Sony provides no customer service for such use.
- Make sure that the bundled writing software and other writing software do not coexist on your computer. In particular, if another packet writing software* exists in your computer, the software and/or computer may operate erratically.

* Such as Drag-to-Disc (ROXIO), Direct CD (ROXIO), B's CLIP (BHA), or DLA (Sonic).

Note

Only round discs should be used with the DVDirect. Never use odd-shaped discs (stars, hearts, card shape, etc.), as they may damage the DVDirect

Recommended Writable Discs

We strongly recommend that you only use discs for which operation has been guaranteed. You can obtain the latest list of writable discs for which operation with the DVDirect has been guaranteed on the user support web site. See page 82 for details.

Note

You can safely use most disc formats that comply with conventional standards with the DVDirect. However, bear in mind that some commercially available discs do not comply with the quality or performance standards necessary for use with the DVDirect. If you use such discs, the DVDirect may automatically adjust the writing speed, or it may not be able to write at all. Even if discs are successfully written on, they may cause errors when read.

Writable Discs and Compatibility

CD-R discs

Data can be written on this type of disc only once, and once it has been written, it cannot be erased. Music CDs created on this media can be played on standard CD players.

CD-RW discs

Data can be written on and erased from this type of disc repeatedly. Typically, a new CD-RW disc can be rewritten about 1,000 times. Music CDs created on this media cannot be played on a CD player unless it is CD-RW compatible.

DVD+R, DVD-R, DVD+R DL, and DVD-R DL discs

Data can be written on this type of disc only once, and once it has been written, it cannot be erased.

DVD+R DL (double layer) and DVD-R DL (dual layer) discs have two layers on one side of the disc and have double the capacity conventional one-layer discs.

DVD+RW and DVD-RW discs

Data can be written on or erased from this type of disc repeatedly. Typically, a new DVD+RW or DVD-RW disc can be rewritten about 1,000 times.

About playback/reading compatibility

CD-R and CD-RW discs created with the DVDirect can be read on most CD-ROM drives. However, some older CD-ROM drives cannot read CD-RW discs.

In addition, CD-R music discs created and finalized with the DVDirect can be played on most CD players, but there are some CD players and automobile CD players that do not support or guarantee playback of CD-R discs.

Because of the differences in quality and characteristics between various CD-ROM drive, CD player, CD-R disc, and CD-RW disc manufacturers, playback may not be possible depending on the combination.*

DVD-Video discs created and finalized with the DVDirect can be played back on most standard DVD players. In addition, DVD-ROM discs created and finalized with the DVDirect can be played back on almost all DVD drives.

However, depending on the combination of the type of player/drive and the disc, playback/reading may not be supported or possible. For example, some drives do not support multi-session/multi-border DVD-ROM discs. In such cases, the drive may only read the first session/border of the disc.

Further, because of the differences in quality and characteristics between various DVD drive, DVD player, and disc manufacturers, playback/reading may not be possible depending on the combination.

*Playback compatibility is not under warranty.

Precautions on Writing/Playing Discs

Write speed and compatible discs

- When writing data to disc at high speeds, you must use the appropriate type of disc.
- Set the writing speed with your writing software. For details on configuring the setting, refer to your writing software documentation.
- Writing speed may be adjusted automatically depending on the quality of the disc used. In addition, writing speed may be limited by the transfer rate of the computer, or the DVDirect may limit writing speed to preserve a good reading quality.

DVD region codes

The playback of DVD-Video (DVD discs) is protected and controlled by a region code setting. To use the DVDirect to play back DVD-Video on your computer, the region code on the DVD, DVDirect, and DVD-Video playback software must be identical.

The region code on the DVDirect can be changed up to five times, including the initial assignment (RPC phase 2* standard). After changing the region code five times, the setting becomes permanent and can no longer be changed. From that point on, you can only play back DVD-Video whose region code matches the one set on the fifth time.

* Region Playback Control (RPC) standard.

Do not attempt to make unauthorized changes to the region code. Any problems resulting from doing so are not covered by the warranty.

Hint

- You can change the region code of the DVDirect from it's properties dialog box which is accessible from the Device Manager.
- DVDs created in stand-alone operation have the region code "All."

Playing back DVD-Video

DVD-Video disc playback conditions are sometimes determined by software manufacturers. Because the drive plays back discs as determined by software manufacturers, some drive functions may not always perform as expected. When playing back DVD-Video, refer to the documentation accompanying each disc.

About copy protected DVDs

Most DVD-Video discs on the market are protected against unauthorized copy. Attempting to copy protected discs violates copyright laws.

About copy controlled CDs

The DVDirect is designed to play back discs conforming to the Compact Disc (CD) standard. Audio CDs encoded with copyright protection technology are now marketed by various record companies. Be aware that some of these discs do not conform to the CD standard, and you may not be able to play them back with the DVDirect. When using the DVDirect as an audio CD player, only use audio CDs with the following mark. Some of these discs are encoded in such a way as to prevent sampling and/or copy, while others can only be played back under certain conditions. For details, refer to the documentation for your audio CD.



Note on DualDiscs

A DualDisc is a two sided disc which mates DVD recorded material on one side with digital audio material on the other side.

However, since the audio material side does not conform to the Compact Disc (CD) standard, playback on the DVDirect is not guaranteed.

About Memory Cards

About “Memory Stick”

A “Memory Stick” is a compact, portable IC recording medium.

The types of “Memory Stick” that can be used with the DVDirect are listed in the table below. However, proper operation is not guaranteed for all “Memory Stick” functions.

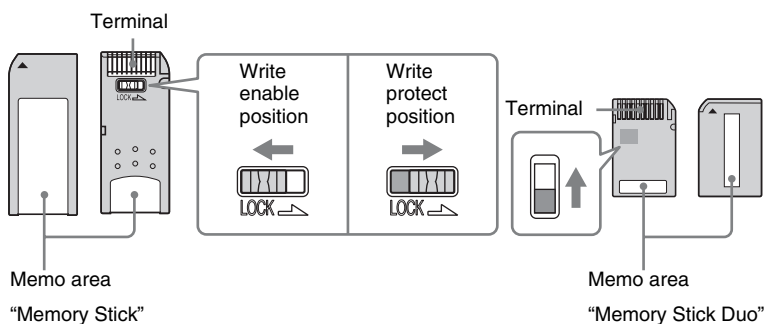
Note

When formatting a “Memory Stick,” use the format function of your digital camera. You can also use “Memory Stick Formatter” on the supplied software disc. To install “Memory Stick Formatter” onto your computer, start the installer, “MSfmtInst240.exe,” located in the folder, “\MSfmt,” on the software disc. To launch “Memory Stick Formatter” after installation, access the “Memory Stick Utility” folder in the program menu of Windows.

However, a “Memory Stick” formatted on a computer may not be usable depending on the digital camera. In this case, the “Memory Stick” needs to be formatted again on the digital camera.

Notes on using “Memory Stick”

- If you slide the write-protect switch to LOCK with a fine-tipped object, you cannot record, edit, or delete images.



- The position and shape of the write-protect switch may differ depending on the “Memory Stick” you use.
- Do not remove the “Memory Stick” while reading or writing data.
- Data may be corrupted in the following cases:
 - when the “Memory Stick” is removed or the DVDirect is turned off during a read operation
 - when the “Memory Stick” is used in locations subject to static electricity or electrical noise

About the CompactFlash/SD/xD-Picture Cards

With the multi memory card slot of the DVDirect, you can use a “Memory Stick,” SD Card, and xD-Picture Card. With the CompactFlash Card slot of the DVDirect, you can use a CompactFlash Storage Card (Type I/Type II) and CF+Card (Type I/Type II)-compatible CompactFlash Storage Card. Not all the memory card operations are supported.

Notes on use

- You cannot use CompactFlash Cards with a power specification of 3V (3.3V or less) only. Do not insert other types of CompactFlash Card into the DVDirect’s insertion slot. The DVDirect may be damaged.
- When using the CompactFlash Card adaptor, the write-protected card may not work properly.
- You cannot read the data of a SD Card subject to copyright protection.

Precautions

Operation and storage conditions

Avoid using or storing the DVDirect in hot or humid locations, or places where it might be subject to severe vibration or direct sunlight.

Transportation

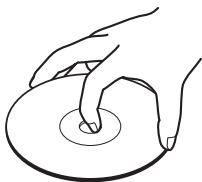
- Please repack the DVDirect in its original carton when shipping by itself.
- If the DVDirect is to be shipped, remove any disc beforehand.

Moisture condensation

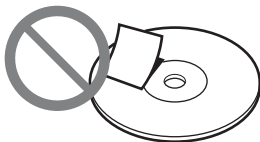
Do not expose the DVDirect to sudden temperature changes. Do not use the DVDirect immediately after moving it from a cold to warm location or raising the room temperature suddenly, as condensation may have formed within the DVDirect. If the temperature changes suddenly while using the DVDirect, keep the power on, but stop using it for at least an hour.

Handling discs

- Handle discs only by the edges. Never touch the recording surface.



- Do not affix labels on discs.



- Do not store discs in dusty or humid locations, in direct sunlight, or near heat-generating devices.

- To protect important data, always keep discs in their cases.
- Do not wipe writable discs using a disc cleaner before recording data. Instead, use a blower to remove any dust.
- Data may not be recorded properly if there are scratches or dust on the unrecorded area of writable discs. Handle discs very carefully.

Handling memory cards

- Do not drop, bend, or submit the memory cards to external shock.
- Do not disassemble or modify the memory cards.
- Avoid touching the terminal of a memory card or touching it with a metal object.
- Avoid getting liquids on a memory card or using them in areas subject to high humidity.
- Avoid using or storing a memory card in a location subject to:
 - extremely high temperature, such as the interior of a car, outdoors exposed to direct sunlight, or near a heater.
 - direct sunlight
 - high humidity
 - corrosive substances
 - excessive dust
 - electrostatic or electronic noises
 - magnetic fields
- When storing or carrying a memory card, keep it in its original case to ensure protection of important data.
- Avoid removing a memory card from its slot or turning off the power button while the DVDirect is accessing it, as data may be rendered unreadable.
